BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 286-106.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$286-106.5 Expiration of licenses; out-of-country
- 4 civilian employees or contractors of the United States
- 5 Department of Defense and active duty military personnel and
- 6 dependents. Notwithstanding section 286-106, the expired
- 7 driver's license of a civilian employee or civilian contractor
- 8 of the United States Department of Defense, a member of any
- 9 component of the United States armed forces who is on active
- 10 federal service, or the member's dependent if the dependent
- 11 accompanied the member, and whose driver's license expired while
- 12 the civilian employee, civilian contractor, or member was
- 13 stationed or deployed outside the United States, shall remain
- 14 valid for ninety days after the civilian employee's, civilian
- 15 contractor's, or service member's return to the United States."
- 16 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

Driver's License; Federal Department of Defense Civilian Employees and Contractors

Specifies that the driver's license of a civilian employee or civilian contractor of the United States Department of Defense that expires while the employee or contractor is stationed outside the United States remains valid for ninety days after the employee or contractor returns to the United States.
