### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REGISTRATION OF VEHICLES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that some individuals and 2 entities intentionally abandon vehicles on roads and highways 3 throughout the State and that it is difficult for the counties 4 to recoup the costs of towing and disposing of these vehicles. 5 The legislature further finds that recouping these costs would 6 be easier for the counties if the costs of towing and disposal 7 were required to be paid as a condition precedent to the 8 registration of vehicles.

9 SECTION 2. Section 286-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

11 "(a) The certificate of registration for each motor 12 vehicle in the counties of the State shall be renewed on a 13 staggered basis as established by each county. The director of 14 finance of each county may adopt rules to carry out the purposes 15 stated in this section and shall expend the necessary funds from 16 the director's operating funds as may be necessary for these 17 purposes; provided that the director of finance, if the director

1 has ascertained as of the date of the application that the registered owner has not deposited or paid bail with respect to 2 any summons or citation issued to the registered owner for 3 4 stopping, standing, or parking in violation of traffic 5 ordinances within the county, or has outstanding charges owed to 6 the county for the towing, removal, or disposal of an abandoned or derelict vehicle within the county, may require, as a 7 condition precedent to the renewal, that the registered owner 8 9 deposit or pay bail with respect to all [such] summonses [or], 10 citations[+], or outstanding charges. The certificates of registration issued hereunder shall show, in addition to all 11 information required under section 286-47, the serial number of 12 13 the tag or emblem and shall be valid during the registration 14 year only for which they are issued. The certificates of 15 ownership need not be renewed annually but shall remain valid as 16 to any interest shown therein until canceled by the director of 17 finance as provided by law or replaced by new certificates of 18 ownership as hereinafter provided."

19 SECTION 3. Section 286-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

1 "(c) Subsection (b), requiring a transferee to forward the 2 certificate of ownership after endorsement to the director of 3 finance, shall not apply to the transferee of a vehicle who was not intending to and does not drive the vehicle or permit the 4 5 vehicle to be driven upon the public highways, but every [such] 6 transferee, upon transferring the transferee's interest or title 7 to another, shall give notice of the transfer to the director of 8 finance and endorse the certificate of ownership to the new 9 legal owner and the certificate of registration to the new 10 owner; provided that if the director of finance has ascertained 11 as of the date of the application that the registered owner has 12 not deposited or paid bail with respect to any summons or 13 citation issued to the registered owner for stopping, standing, 14 or parking in violation of traffic ordinances within the county, 15 or has outstanding charges owed to the county for the towing, 16 removal, or disposal of an abandoned or derelict vehicle within 17 the county, the director may require, as a condition precedent 18 to the transfer, that the registered owner deposit or pay bail 19 with respect to all [such] summons [or], citations[-], or 20 outstanding charges."
