#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRIC FOOT SCOOTERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part XII to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§291C- Electric foot scooters. (a) This section
5	shall apply whenever an electric foot scooter is operated on any
6	highway, roadway, or other designated public area set aside for
7	the use of vehicles. Every person operating an electric foot
8	scooter in these areas shall be granted all of the rights and
9	shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to a driver of
10	a vehicle under this chapter, except as to:
11	(1) Provisions of this section to the contrary; and
12	(2) Provisions of this chapter which, by their nature, can
13	have no application.
14	(b) The counties shall regulate the operation of electric
15	foot scooters, including the following:
16	(1) Operation on roadways, bikeways, bicycle paths, and
17	sidewalks;



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1	(2) Maximum allowable speed;
2	(3) Safe operation; and
3	(4) Insurance requirements;
4	provided that no authority adopted in accordance with this
5	subsection shall be less restrictive than the requirements set
6	forth in this section.
7	(c) No person under fifteen years of age shall operate an
8	electric foot scooter on a highway, street, roadway, or any
9	other public property in the State. No person less than sixteen
10	years of age shall operate an electric foot scooter unless
11	wearing a safety helmet securely fastened with a chin strap.
12	The safety helmet shall meet the specifications and requirements
13	of a bicycle helmet.
14	(d) No person shall operate an electric foot scooter while
15	carrying any other person nor shall any person other than the
16	operator ride on an electric foot scooter.
17	(e) No person operating an electric foot scooter shall
18	carry any package, bundle, or article that prevents the use of
19	both hands to control and operate the electric foot scooter.
20	(f) Any electric foot scooter used from thirty minutes
21	after sunset until thirty minutes before sunrise shall be



1	equipped	as provided in section 291C-147; provided that in lieu
2	of the re	quirement of section 291C-147(b), every electric foot
3	scooter s	hall be equipped with a lighted lamp visible from the
4	rear.	
5	<u>(g)</u>	No person shall operate an electric foot scooter at a
6	speed gre	ater than fifteen miles per hour or at a speed other
7	than is r	easonable and prudent under the conditions and having
8	regard to	the actual and potential hazards then existing.
9	(h)	Any person who operates an electric foot scooter
10	recklessl	y in disregard for the safety of persons or property
11	shall be	assessed penalties as set forth in section 291C-161.
12	<u>(i)</u>	A person or entity who provides electric foot scooters
13	for hire	shall not rent or lease an electric foot scooter to any
14	person un	less:
15	(1)	Each renter or lessee that is under fifteen years of
16		age wears a safety helmet while operating the rented
17		electric foot scooter, as required in subsection (c);
18		and
19	(2)	Each renter or lessee is provided with a copy of the
20		rules for electric foot scooters as adopted by the
21		county where the electric foot scooter is operating.



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1	(j) An electric foot scooter shall be registered in a
2	manner similar to a low-speed electric bicycle and shall be
3	subject to a permanent registration fee of \$30, paid by the
4	owner to the director of finance."
5	SECTION 2. Section 249-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended as follows:
7	1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
8	and to read:
9	""Electric foot scooter" means a device weighing less than
10	fifty pounds, with two or three wheels, handlebars, and a
11	floorboard that a person can stand upon while riding, that is
12	solely powered by an electric motor or human power, and that has
13	a maximum speed, with or without human propulsion on a paved
14	level surface, of no more than fifteen miles per hour."
15	2. By amending the definition of "moped" to read:
16	""Moped" means a device upon which a person may ride
17	[which] that has two or three wheels in contact with the ground,
18	a motor having a maximum power output capability measured at the
19	motor output shaft, in accordance with the Society of Automotive
20	Engineers standards, of two horsepower (one thousand four
21	hundred ninety-two watts) or less and, if it is a combustion



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engine, a maximum piston or rotor displacement of 3.05 cubic 1 2 inches (fifty cubic centimeters) and [which] that will propel 3 the device, unassisted, on a level surface at a maximum speed no 4 greater than thirty miles per hour; and a direct or automatic 5 power drive system [which] that requires no clutch or gear shift operation by the moped driver after the drive system is engaged 6 7 with the power unit. "Moped" does not include an electric foot 8 scooter." 9 SECTION 3. Section 286-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended as follows: 11 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 12 and to read: 13 ""Electric foot scooter" has the same meaning as defined in 14 section 249-1." 15 2. By amending the definition of "moped" to read: 16 "Moped" [means a device upon which a person may ride which 17 has two or three wheels in contact with the ground, a motor 18 having a maximum power output capability measured at the motor 19 output shaft, in accordance with the Society of Automotive 20 Engineers standards, of two horsepower (one thousand four 21 hundred ninety-two watts) or less and, if it is a combustion

9	SECTION 4. Section 291-31.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as
11	follows:
12	"§291-31.5 Blue lights prohibited for motor vehicles,
13	motorcycles, motor scooters, bicycles, <u>electric foot scooters,</u>
14	and mopeds. (a) No person shall knowingly operate, affix or
15	cause to be affixed, display, or possess any lamp, reflector, or
16	illumination device that appears to be the color blue, or colors
17	blue and red, upon any motor vehicle, motorcycle, motor scooter,
18	bicycle, electric foot scooter, or moped except for:
19	(1) County law enforcement vehicles authorized and
20	approved by the chief of police of the county in which
21	the vehicle is operated;



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1	(2)	Department of public safety law enforcement vehicles	
2		with blue and red lamps, reflectors, or illumination	
3		devices authorized and approved by the director of	
4		public safety;	
5	(3)	Department of land and natural resources division of	
6		conservation and resources enforcement vehicles with	
7		blue and red lamps, reflectors, or illumination	
8		devices authorized and approved by the chairperson of	
9		the board of land and natural resources; or	
10	(4)	Department of transportation division of harbors law	
11		enforcement vehicles with blue and red lamps,	
12		reflectors, or illumination devices authorized and	
13		approved by the director of transportation.	
14	This proh	ibition shall not apply to factory-installed instrument	
15	illuminat	ion."	
16	SECT	ION 5. Section 291C-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

17	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
18	"(a) No person shall drive any vehicle other than a
19	bicycle, electric foot scooter, or moped upon a bicycle lane or
20	bicycle path, except upon a permanent or authorized temporary
21	driveway, or park any vehicle upon a bicycle lane or bicycle



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1	path; pro	vided that any vehicle may be driven or parked in a
2	bicycle l	ane or bicycle path as applicable if:
3	(1)	It is in the process of executing a legal turn, lane
4		change, or parking maneuver;
5	(2)	It is an authorized emergency vehicle performing the
6		functions under section 291C-26;
7	(3)	It is an official federal, state, or county vehicle in
8		the performance of its actual duty;
9	(4)	It is a stalled or broken vehicle;
10	(5)	It is necessary to assist a stalled or broken vehicle;
11	(6)	It is necessary to yield to an authorized emergency
12		vehicle pursuant to section 291C-65; or
13	(7)	It is otherwise provided by law."
14	SECT	ION 7. Section 707-700, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended b	y amending the definition of "vulnerable user" to read
16	as follow	s:
17	""Vu	lnerable user" means:
18	(1)	A pedestrian legally within a street or public
19		highway;
20	(2)	A roadway worker actually engaged in work upon a
21		street or public highway or in work upon utility



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1		facilities along a street or public highway, or
2		engaged in the provision of emergency services within
3		a street or public highway, including but not limited
4		to:
5		(a) Construction and maintenance workers; and
6		(b) Police, fire, and other emergency responders; or
7	(3)	A person legally operating any of the following within
8		the street or public highway:
9		(a) A bicycle;
10		(b) A moped;
11		(c) An electric personal assistive mobility device;
12		[ <del>or</del> ]
13		(d) A wheelchair conveyance or other personal
14		<pre>mobility device[+]; or</pre>
15		(e) An electric foot scooter."
16	SECT	ION 8. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
17	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
18	begun bef	ore its effective date.
19	SECT	ION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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#### Report Title:

Hawaii Council of Mayors Package; Electric Foot Scooters; Regulation

#### Description:

Grants electric foot scooters the same rights and subjects them to the same duties as other vehicles, with certain exceptions. Applies blue light prohibition to electric foot scooters. Applies "vulnerable user" definition to include electric foot scooters. Amends "moped" definition to exclude electric foot scooters.
