A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the dependent
- 2 children and the surviving spouses of firefighters killed or
- 3 severely injured in the line of duty face many challenges, both
- 4 emotionally and economically. One way to help these individuals
- 5 is to provide college tuition assistance through the university
- 6 of Hawaii system.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to provide the surviving
- 8 children and spouses of firefighters killed or severely injured
- 9 in the line of duty with a tuition waiver from the university of
- 10 Hawaii system.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by adding a new section to part II, subpart B, to be
- 13 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 14 "§304A- Surviving firefighter family member program;
- 15 established. (a) Notwithstanding section 304A-501, there is
- 16 established the surviving firefighter family member program to
- 17 be administered by the board of regents. The program shall

2		funding sources that do not require repayment;			
3	(4)	Is enrolled in a classified degree or certificate			
4		program with six or more credits per semester; and			
5	(5)	Maintains satisfactory academic progress, as defined			
6		by federal requirements established pursuant to Title			
7		IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended,			
8		and determined by the campus at which the student is			
9		enrolled.			
10	The board of regents may require each applicant to submit				
11	documenta	tion demonstrating satisfaction of the eligibility			
12	requireme	ents of this subsection.			
13	<u>(c)</u>	Tuition waivers shall be awarded to the extent			
14	possible	based on available funds and on a greatest need basis.			
15	<u>(d)</u>	To maintain a tuition waiver under this section, a			
16	student s	hall maintain satisfaction of the requirements of			
17	subsectio	on (b) on an annual basis.			
18	<u>(e)</u>	Any tuition waiver issued pursuant to this section			
19	shall be	limited to a maximum of eight semesters per student.			
20	<u>(f)</u>	Any applicant who wilfully misrepresents eligibility			
21	for the b	penefits provided under this section, or any person who			

- 1 knowingly aids or abets an applicant in misrepresenting
- 2 eligibility for any benefits, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."
- 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the
- 6 surviving firefighter family member program.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the university of
- 8 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
