# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 136, Session
2	Laws of Hawaii 2019, established that all elections statewide
3	were to be conducted by mail beginning with the 2020 primary
4	election. This Act allows election officials to establish
5	additional voter service centers, beyond the single center
6	designated for each county, and permits these additional voter
7	service centers to operate during different days and times.
8	This addresses the needs of voters in certain areas where no
9	voter service center would have been established due to an
10	inability to obtain a facility or requisite personnel to support
11	the operation of a voter service center for ten business days or
12	the hours established for voter service centers statewide.
13	SECTION 2. Section 11-109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
15	"(a) Voter service centers shall be established [at the
16	office of the clerk, and may be established at additional
17	locations within a county as may be designated by a clerk by

- 1 the clerks to service the particular needs of [a] each county's
- 2 voters. For a county with more than one island in its
- 3 jurisdiction, there shall be at least one voter service center
- 4 on each island; provided that the island of Niihau shall not be
- 5 subject to this requirement.
- 6 (b) [Voter service centers] In each county, a voter
- 7 service center shall be open from the tenth business day
- 8 preceding the day of the election during regular business hours
- 9 until the time provided in section 11-131 on the date of the
- 10 election and at the same times statewide. The clerks may
- 11 operate additional voter service centers having varying days or
- 12 hours of operations to service the voters of particular areas
- 13 that otherwise could not support the operation of a voter
- 14 service center for ten business days or the same times
- 15 statewide; provided that all voter service centers shall remain
- 16 open until 7:00 p.m. on the date of the election. Any voter
- 17 standing in line at a voter service center at the closing time
- 18 provided in section 11-131 on the date of the election and
- 19 having the intent of voting shall be allowed to vote. A person
- 20 eligible to vote but who is not registered to vote and is
- 21 standing in line at a voter service center at the closing time

- 1 provided in section 11-131 on the date of the election shall be
- 2 permitted to apply under section 11-15.2 to register to vote and
- 3 subsequently vote that election day. To the extent the
- 4 registration clerk determines the applicant to be registered at
- 5 that time, the applicant will be permitted to vote by regular
- 6 ballot. If additional time is required to process the
- 7 application, the applicant will be provided a provisional
- 8 ballot."
- 9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
