A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST PROPERTY RIGHTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes contain a number of

2 provisions aimed at addressing the high number of vehicle thefts

3 that occur on the island of Oahu. Frequently, a stolen vehicle

4 is recovered during the commission of a crime or after it has

5 been used to commit other crimes. In many vehicle theft cases,

6 the vehicle is recovered while being operated or occupied by

7 individuals who were not authorized to operate or occupy the

8 vehicle. However, law enforcement may be unable to connect the

actual theft of the vehicle with a specific individual.

10 Current statutory provisions have been rendered ineffective

11 by state court rulings that require the State to prove that a

12 defendant operating or occupying a stolen vehicle knew that the

vehicle was stolen. In the great majority of cases, this

14 requires a confession from the defendant, which may be difficult

15 to obtain because defendants have the right to remain silent.

16 Thus, law enforcement is often hindered in meeting the burden of

17 proof needed to prosecute these cases.

12	propelled	vehicle if:
13	<u>(a)</u>	The propelled vehicle was taken in an act of theft in
14		the first degree under section 708-830.5, theft in the
15		second degree under section 708-831, theft in the
16		third degree under section 708-832, theft in the
17		fourth degree under section 708-833, or unauthorized
18		control of propelled vehicle under section 708-836;

20	<u>(b)</u>	The person recklessly or negligently obtains
21		possession of the propelled vehicle from another

1	person without first making a reasonable inquiry as to		
2	whether the other person had the legal right to sell		
3	or deliver the propelled vehicle.		
4	(2) Unauthorized detention of propelled vehicle is a		
5	misdemeanor.		
6	(3) For the purposes of this section, "propelled vehicle"		
7	shall have the same meaning as in section 708-836(2)."		
8	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that		
9	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
10	begun before its effective date.		
1	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		
12	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
