A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 51, Session Laws 2 of Hawaii 2004, known as the Reinventing Education Act of 2004, 3 established a weighted student formula to allocate moneys to schools according to the different costs of educating students 4 5 with different needs. Despite the intended equitable distribution of funds, the legislature finds that the weighted 6 student formula has placed small, remote schools at a 7 8 disadvantage. For example, in the county of Maui, at Hana high 9 and elementary school, the budgetary shortfall has resulted in 10 the loss of several well-qualified teachers from the school. 11 The legislature finds that these losses have threatened the 12 ability of this school to offer minimum course requirements for 13 students to earn high school diplomas. The legislature further finds that if Hana high and elementary school is unable to offer 14 15 its high school students the requisite courses for graduation, 16 those students will have to endure a nearly forty-mile, two-hour 17 drive to the next closest public high school.



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1	The legislature finds that despite the current economic
2	situation, remote schools should be funded to retain the minimal
3	personnel and resources necessary to graduate students.
4	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize
5	supplemental funding for remote schools.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding a new section to part V, subpart B, to be
8	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
9	" §302A- <u>Remote schools funding.</u> (a) Subject to
10	legislative appropriations, a remote school may receive
11	supplemental funding to support the hiring of additional
12	instruction and support staff.
13	(b) For purposes of this section, "remote school" means
14	any public school, as defined in section 302A-101, that is a
15	high school located:
16	(1) At least a one-hour drive away from the next nearest
17	public high school; or
18	(2) On the islands of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau;
19	provided that if a high school is combined with an elementary,
20	middle, intermediate, or other lower level of schooling, the
21	entire school shall be deemed a high school for purposes of this



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1	section; provided further that this section shall not apply to
1	section, provided infiner that this section shart not apply to
2	any charter school governed by chapter 302D."
3	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
5	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to fund
6	remote schools pursuant to this Act.
7	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8	education for the purposes of this Act.
9	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
