#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BROADBAND.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii needs to better address critical broadband infrastructure in the State by 2 3 establishing an open access, carrier neutral cable landing 4 station to attract transpacific fiber optic cables and expand 5 Hawaii's connectivity around the world, which will establish 6 Hawaii as a key player in the global broadband market and 7 address the need for better broadband connection. Attracting 8 partners with the necessary technical expertise and resources 9 has the potential to develop Hawaii into a strategic **10** communications and knowledge hub in the Pacific. This hub would
- to communications and knowledge hab in the Facility. This hab wou
- 11 integrate a robust global communications network and edge
- 12 computing for the development of next generation applications,
- 13 such as artificial intelligence and smart communities.
- In 2008, the Hawaii broadband task force submitted a final
- 15 report to the legislature that made several key recommendations.
- 16 The task force recommended, among other things, that Hawaii
- 17 should "aggressively promote the landing of new trans-Pacific

- 1 submarine fiber in Hawaii, including a shared access cable
- 2 station that reduces barriers to fiber landing in Hawaii" to
- 3 maximize Hawaii's connectivity to the world. In 2018,
- 4 TeleGeography, a telecommunications market research and
- 5 consulting firm, released an update on the status of six new
- 6 transpacific fiber optic projects linking Asia and North
- 7 America. However, none of these six will land in Hawaii.
- 8 The legislature further finds that the timing for an open
- 9 access, carrier neutral cable landing is critical due to various
- 10 federal and private contracts that are available to Hawaii, such
- 11 as the South American Pacific Link, which would connect Hawaii
- 12 to South America, Central America, and the East coast of the
- 13 United States continent. An open access, carrier neutral cable
- 14 landing would also benefit the State by creating a level playing
- 15 field for telecommunications carriers, improving access to
- 16 broadband, and creating new means of economic development in the
- 17 State.
- 18 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 19 (1) Establish a public-private partnership with the Hawaii
- 20 technology development corporation to build and manage

7	SECTION 2. (a) The Hawaii technology development	
8	corporation shall seek to establish a public-private partnership	
9	with a private organization to plan, build, and manage key	
10	strategic broadband infrastructure that benefits the State and	
11	attract cloud based companies to utilize this key strategic	
12	broadband infrastructure.	
13	(b) The pub	olic-private partnership shall be exempt from
14	chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and shall develop	
15	internal policies and procedures for the procurement of goods,	
16	services, and construction that are consistent with the goals of	
17	public accountability and public procurement.	
18	(c) Pursuar	nt to Act 193, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016,
19	actions taken by	the public-private partnership shall be exempt
20	from certain stat	e and county requirements, except to the extent
21	that such require	ements are mandated by federal law or is

- 1 necessary to protect eligibility for federal funding, services,
- 2 or other assistance.
- 3 The public-private partnership shall comply with all
- 4 applicable safety and engineering requirements relating to the
- 5 installation, improvement, construction, or development of
- 6 infrastructure relating to broadband service.
- 7 A person or entity of the public-private partnership taking
- 8 any action under this subsection shall, at least thirty calendar
- 9 days before the action is taken, provide notice to the director
- 10 of commerce and consumer affairs by electronic posting in the
- 11 form and on the site designated by the director of such posting
- 12 on the designated central State utility or government entity for
- 13 an action relating to the installation, improvement,
- 14 construction, or development of infrastructure relating to
- 15 broadband service or broadband technology where the action taken
- 16 is to provide access as the owner of the exiting rights-of-ways,
- 17 utility easements, or telecommunications infrastructure.
- 18 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$10,000,000 or so
- 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and
- 21 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal



- 1 year 2020-2021 for the Hawaii broadband initiative and the
- 2 establishment of an open access, carrier neutral cable landing
- 3 station.

- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 5 technology development corporation for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
