A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state capitol
- 2 auditorium sound system has become outdated and needs an
- 3 upgrade. It is the legislature's intent to empower all
- 4 residents in our island state to participate in the legislative
- 5 process. The legislature further finds the benefits of an
- 6 updated sound system, compatible with the installation of any
- 7 future upgrades that will allow for remote participation via
- 8 web-based and video technologies, to be twofold. An updated
- 9 system would allow both parties in-person and listeners on the
- 10 Capitol TV or 'Olelo Community Television to hear testimony and
- 11 discussion better. Also, a sound system compatible with web-
- 12 based and video technologies would not only optimize civic
- 13 engagement, especially from those on neighbor islands and in
- 14 rural Oahu, but also be cost-effective against any future
- 15 upgrades.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the
- 2 upgrade of the sound system in the auditorium and conference
- 3 rooms at the state capitol.
- 4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to
- 7 update the sound system in the auditorium and conference rooms
- 8 at the state capitol.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
