A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CESSPOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's streams,
groundwater, and ocean are being harmed by nonpoint
contamination sources that flow directly off the land, rather
than through pipes or ditches. Cesspools are a nonpoint
contamination source of great concern. These substandard
systems are essentially holes in the ground that do not treat
wastewater but merely dispose of it.

8 The legislature further finds that there are approximately 9 eighty-eight thousand cesspools in the State, with approximately 10 fifty thousand on Hawaii island, fourteen thousand on Kauai, 11 twelve thousand on Maui, eleven thousand on Oahu, and one 12 thousand four hundred on Molokai. Collectively, the State's 13 cesspools release more than fifty-three million gallons of 14 untreated sewage into the ground each day. Hawaii relies on 15 groundwater for ninety per cent of its drinking water.

16 The legislature finds that in 2017, legislation was enacted 17 requiring all cesspools not excluded by the director of health



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to be upgraded or converted to septic systems or aerobic 1 treatment unit systems, or connected to sewage systems by 2 3 January 1, 2050. While this mandate may encourage some landowners to act now to reduce water contamination, there is 4 little sense of urgency, and these changes will impose 5 6 substantial costs on private landowners. 7 The purpose of this Act is to establish a low interest loan program to offer financial assistance to cesspool owners who 8 upgrade or convert their cesspools to septic systems or aerobic 9 10 treatment unit systems, or who connect their systems to existing sewer systems or any other wastewater treatment systems approved 11 12 by the department of health. SECTION 2. Chapter 342D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 15 and to read as follows: "§342D- Cesspool remediation and conversion loan 16 program. (a) There is established the cesspool remediation and 17 conversion loan program to be administered by the department in 18 coordination with each county water and sewage department. The 19 program may provide low interest loans to: 20 (1) Upgrade or convert a cesspool to:

17	(12)	Enable the department to coordinate with each county
18		agency responsible for wastewater to establish a low
19		interest loan program to upgrade or convert cesspools
20		to septic systems or aerobic treatment unit systems,
21		or to connect cesspools to existing sewer systems or



1	any other wastewater treatment systems approved by the
2	department."
