A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL LUNCH REFORM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that proper nutrition is
- 2 an important part of a student's healthy learning environment.
- 3 As such, the removal or refusal of a student's lunch due to the
- 4 inability to pay creates an unhealthy learning environment for
- 5 the student.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to minimize the situations where
- 7 a student may be denied a school meal because of the student's
- 8 inability to pay.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 302A-404, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- "\$302A-404 School meals[+]; report. (a) School meals
- 12 shall be made available under the school meals program in every
- 13 school where the students are required to eat meals at school.
- 14 (b) No student shall be denied a meal or served an
- 15 alternative meal solely for failure to pay:
- 16 (1) Within the first [twenty one] thirty days of the first
- semester of a school year while the student's



1		application for free or reduced lunch is being	
2		processed; or	
3	(2)	Within [seven] thirty days after a student's meal fund	
4		account reaches a zero or negative balance.	
5	<u>(c)</u>	A school may not permit public identification or	
6	stigmatiz	ation of the student due to inability to pay for a	
7	school meal, such as by:		
8	(1)	Requiring the student to wear a wristband or hand	
9		stamp;	
10	(2)	Requiring the student to perform chores or activities	
11		that are not required of students generally; or	
12	(3)	Depriving the student of food after it has been	
13		served.	
14	[(c)	d) (d) The department may adopt rules or policies	
15	governing	the collection of funds for student meal accounts with	
16	a negative fund balance; provided that no rule or policy shall		
17	prohibit	feeding a student as required pursuant to subsection	
18	(b).		
19	<u>(e)</u>	Any communication related to outstanding credit must	
20	be direct	ed to the student's parent or guardian. A student may	
21	be requir	ed to deliver a letter regarding outstanding credit	

1	that is addressed to a parent of guardian if the fetter is not		
2	distributed to the student in a manner that stigmatizes the		
3	student.		
4	(f)	The department of education shall submit a report to	
5	the legis	lature no later than twenty days prior to the convening	
6	of the regular session of each year on the prevalence of		
7	students being denied a school meal solely for failure to pay		
8	and any actions taken by the department of education or		
9	individua	l schools to address this issue. The report shall	
10	include:		
11	(1)	The number of meals that have been denied because of a	
12		zero or negative balance in a student's meal fund	
13		account;	
14	(2)	The number of students who have been denied a meal	
15		because of a zero or negative balance;	
16	(3)	The reasons for the zero or negative balance and	
17		subsequent meal denial;	
18	(4)	Steps the department is taking to make the process of	
19		paying for meals easier;	

1	(5)	Procedures for notifying parents of low or negative	
2		balances, including when and how they are notified;	
3		and	
4	(6)	The standard operating procedure for low or negative	
5		balance notification and subsequent meal denial.	
6	<u>(g)</u>	The department of education shall use moneys in the	
7	special school lunch fund to provide school meals at no charge		
8	for children in kindergarten through twelfth grade who are		
9	participating in the school meals program and who would		
10	otherwise be required to pay a reduced price for meals."		
11	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$800,000 or so much		
13	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be		
14	deposited to the credit of the special school lunch fund		
15	established pursuant to section 302A-405, Hawaii Revised		
16	Statutes.		
17	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of		
18	education for the purposes of this Act.		
19	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
20	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
21	SECT	TION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.	

Report Title:

Department of Education; School Meals; Free or Reduced Lunch; Students; Appropriation

Description:

Increases the number of days by which students have to apply for free or reduced lunch and to replenish the student's meal fund. Requires the department of education to report to the legislature regarding the number of students who are denied meals based on the inability to pay. Prohibits serving an alternative meal to students who are unable to pay. Appropriates funds to the special school lunch fund. (SD1)
