A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IMMIGRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are many
- 2 immigrants who seek to continue legal residence or otherwise may
- 3 be unaware of their rights and legal status in the country.
- 4 The legislature further finds that Hawaii has always
- 5 embraced a welcoming attitude for people of all backgrounds,
- 6 nationalities, and ethnicities. According to the 2017 American
- 7 Immigration Council Fact Sheet, nearly eighteen per cent of
- 8 Hawaii residents are immigrants, while more than one in seven
- 9 residents is a native-born United States citizen with at least
- 10 one immigrant parent. Immigrants are an integral part of
- 11 Hawaii's diverse, multicultural community and make extensive
- 12 contributions to the State.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 14 Judiciary to contract out to provide legal assistance and legal
- 15 counsel to immigrants in determining legal status and
- 16 citizenship, provide diversion to existing services, and
- 17 otherwise provide counsel for existing rights.



- 1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 5 2020-2021 to the judiciary to contract with the legal aid
- 6 society of Hawaii to provide legal assistance and legal counsel
- 7 to immigrants in determining legal status and citizenship,
- 8 provide diversion to existing services, and otherwise provide
- 9 counsel for existing rights.
- 10 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary
- 11 for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on March 15, 2050.
