A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE INSURANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
1	SECTION 1. The registrature finds that the department of
2	health reports cancer as the second leading cause of death among
3	Hawaii residents, claiming more than two thousand two hundred
4	Hawaii residents each year. The legislature further finds that
5	cancer patients should have full access to effective treatment
6	options at early stages of their illnesses. Step therapy
7	policies delay getting cancer patients the right drug or
8	treatment at the right time, and treatments are far too often
9	health plan- or provider-centered, rather than patient-centered
10	The purpose of this Act is to:

(1) Prohibit health insurers that cover treatment for stage two through stage four cancer from requiring an insured diagnosed with stage two through stage four cancer to undergo step therapy prior to covering the insured for the drug prescribed by the insured's health care provider, under certain conditions; and

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1	(2)	Require the auditor to conduct an impact assessment
2		report to assess the social and financial impacts of
3		the mandated health insurance coverage.

8	treatment	of stage two through stage four cancer shall require a
9	subscribe	r or member who is diagnosed with a stage two through
10	stage fou	r cancer to undergo step therapy prior to covering the
11	drug pres	cribed by the subscriber's or member's health care
12	provider	if the prescribed drug is a prescription drug:
13	(1)	That is approved by the United States Food and Drug
14		Administration;
15	(2)	Whose use is consistent with best practices for the
16		treatment of the cancer or treatment of side effects
17		of the cancer;
18	(3)	That is listed in one of the approved compendia;
19	(4)	That is supported by a published peer-reviewed study

5	prescription drug or sequence of prescription drugs, other than
6	the drug that the subscriber's or member's health care provider
7	recommends for the subscriber's or member's treatment, before
8	the mutual benefit society provides coverage for the recommended
9	prescription drug."
10	SECTION 5. Chapter 432D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
12	and to read as follows:
13	"§432D- Step therapy prohibited; stage two through
14	stage four cancer. (a) No policy, contract, plan, or agreement
15	issued or renewed in the State after December 31, 2020, that
16	provides coverage for the treatment of stage two through stage
17	four cancer shall require an enrollee who is diagnosed with a
18	stage two through stage four cancer to undergo step therapy
19	prior to covering the drug prescribed by the enrollee's health
20	care provider if the prescribed drug is a prescription drug:

1	(1)	That is approved by the United States Food and Drug
2		Administration;
3	(2)	Whose use is consistent with best practices for the
4		treatment of the cancer or treatment of side effects
5		of the cancer;
6	(3)	That is listed in one of the approved compendia;
7	(4)	That is supported by a published peer-reviewed study
8		as a recognized off-label use for the treatment of the
9		cancer or treatment of side effects of the cancer; or
10	(5)	That is listed on the health maintenance
11		organization's prescription drug formulary.
12	(b)	For the purposes of this section, "step therapy" means
13	a protoco	l that requires an enrollee to use a prescription drug
14	or sequen	ce of prescription drugs, other than the drug that the
15	enrollee'	s health care provider recommends for the enrollee's
16	treatment	, before the health maintenance organization provides
17	coverage	for the recommended prescription drug."
18	SECT	ION 6. (a) The auditor shall conduct an impact
19	assessmen	t report pursuant to sections 23-51 and 23-52, Hawaii
20	Revised S	tatutes, to assess the social and financial impacts of
21	the manda	te specified in sections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of this Act.

- 1 (b) The auditor shall submit a report of its findings and
- 2 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
- 3 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 4 the regular session of 2021.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 6 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 7 begun before its effective date.
- 8 SECTION 8. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Description:

Prohibits a health care insurer, mutual benefit society, or health maintenance organization from requiring an insured, subscriber, member, or enrollee diagnosed with stage two through stage four cancer to undergo step therapy prior to covering the insured for the drug prescribed by the insured's health care provider, under certain conditions, for health insurance policies and contracts issued or renewed after 12/31/2020. Requires Auditor to conduct impact assessment report on mandated health insurance coverage. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)
