## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE INSURANCE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
2	health reports cancer as the second leading cause of death among
3	Hawaii residents, claiming more than two thousand two hundred
4	Hawaii residents each year. The legislature further finds that
5	cancer patients should have full access to effective treatment
6	options at early stages of their illnesses. Step therapy
7	policies delay getting cancer patients the right drug or
8	treatment at the right time, and treatments are far too often
9	health plan- or provider-centered, rather than patient-centered.
10	The purpose of this Act is to prohibit health insurers that
11	cover treatment for stage two through stage four cancer from
12	requiring an insured diagnosed with stage two through stage four
13	cancer to undergo step therapy prior to covering the insured for
14	the drug prescribed by the insured's health care provider, under
15	certain conditions.

1	SECT	TON 2. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part I of article 10A to be
3	appropria	tely designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§43</u>	1:10A- Step therapy prohibited; stage two through
5	stage fou	r cancer. (a) No individual policy of accident and
6	health or	sickness insurance issued or renewed in the State
7	after Dec	ember 31, 2020, that provides coverage for the
8	treatment	of stage two through stage four cancer shall require
9	an insure	d who is diagnosed with a stage two through stage four
10	cancer to	undergo step therapy prior to covering the drug
11	prescribe	d by the insured's health care provider if the
12	prescribe	d drug is a prescription drug:
13	(1)	That is approved by the United States Food and Drug
14		Administration;
15	(2)	Whose use is consistent with best practices for the
16		treatment of the cancer or treatment of side effects
17		of the cancer;
18	(3)	That is listed in one of the approved compendia;
19	(4)	That is supported by a published peer reviewed study
20		as a recognized off-label use for the treatment of the
21		cancer or treatment of side effects of the cancer; or

1	(5) That is listed on the insurer's prescription drug
2	formulary.
3	(b) For the purposes of this section, "step therapy" means
4	a protocol that requires an insured to use a prescription drug
5	or sequence of prescription drugs, other than the drug that the
6	insured's health care provider recommends for the insured's
7	treatment, before the insurer provides coverage for the
8	recommended prescription drug."
9	SECTION 3. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by adding a new section to part II of article 10A to be
11	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
12	"§431:10A- Step therapy prohibited; stage two through
13	stage four cancer. (a) No group policy of accident and health
14	or sickness insurance issued or renewed in the State after
15	December 31, 2020, that provides coverage for the treatment of
16	stage two through stage four cancer shall require an insured who
17	is diagnosed with a stage two through stage four cancer to
18	undergo step therapy prior to covering the drug prescribed by
19	the insured's health care provider if the prescribed drug is a
20	prescription drug:

1	(1)	That is approved by the United States Food and Drug
2		Administration;
3	(2)	Whose use is consistent with best practices for the
4		treatment of the cancer or treatment of side effects
5		of the cancer;
6	(3)	That is listed in one of the approved compendia;
7	(4)	That is supported by a published peer reviewed study
8		as a recognized off-label use for the treatment of the
9		cancer or treatment of side effects of the cancer; or
10	(5)	That is listed on the insurer's prescription drug
11		formulary.
12	(b)	For the purposes of this section, "step therapy" means
13	a protoco	l that requires an insured to use a prescription drug
14	or sequen	ce of prescription drugs, other than the drug that the
15	insured's	health care provider recommends for the insured's
16	treatment	, before the insurer provides coverage for the
17	recommend	ed prescription drug."
18	SECT	ION 4. Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended b	y adding a new section to part VI of article 1 to be
20	appropria	tely designated and to read as follows:

1	" <u>§43</u>	2:1- Step therapy prohibited; stage two through
2	stage fou	r cancer. (a) No individual or group hospital or
3	medical s	ervice plan contract issued or renewed in the State
4	after Dec	ember 31, 2020, that provides coverage for the
5	treatment	of stage two through stage four cancer shall require a
6	subscribe	r or member who is diagnosed with a stage two through
7	stage fou	r cancer to undergo step therapy prior to covering the
8	drug pres	cribed by the subscriber's or member's health care
9	provider	if the prescribed drug is a prescription drug:
10	(1)	That is approved by the United States Food and Drug
11		Administration;
12	(2)	Whose use is consistent with best practices for the
13		treatment of the cancer or treatment of side effects
14		of the cancer;
15	(3)	That is listed in one of the approved compendia;
16	(4)	That is supported by a published peer reviewed study
17		as a recognized off-label use for the treatment of the
18		cancer or treatment of side effects of the cancer; or
19	<u>(5)</u>	That is listed on the mutual benefit society's
20		prescription drug formulary.

1	(b) For the purposes of this section, "step therapy" means
2	a protocol that requires a subscriber or member to use a
3	prescription drug or sequence of prescription drugs, other than
4	the drug that the subscriber's or member's health care provider
5	recommends for the subscriber's or member's treatment, before
6	the mutual benefit society provides coverage for the recommended
7	prescription drug."
8	SECTION 5. Chapter 432D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
10	and to read as follows:
11	"§432D- Step therapy prohibited; stage two through
12	stage four cancer. (a) No policy, contract, plan, or agreement
13	issued or renewed in the State after December 31, 2020, that
14	provides coverage for the treatment of stage two through stage
15	four cancer shall require an enrollee who is diagnosed with a
16	stage two through stage four cancer to undergo step therapy
17	prior to covering the drug prescribed by the enrollee's health
18	care provider if the prescribed drug is a prescription drug:
19	(1) That is approved by the United States Food and Drug

1	(2)	Whose use is consistent with best practices for the
2	,	treatment of the cancer or treatment of side effects
3		of the cancer;
4	(3)	That is listed in one of the approved compendia;
5	(4)	That is supported by a published peer reviewed study
6		as a recognized off-label use for the treatment of the
7		cancer or treatment of side effects of the cancer; or
8	(5)	That is listed on the health maintenance
9		organization's prescription drug formulary.
10	(b)	For the purposes of this section, "step therapy" means
11	a protoco	l that requires an enrollee to use a prescription drug
12	or sequen	ce of prescription drugs, other than the drug that the
13	enrollee'	s health care provider recommends for the enrollee's
14	treatment	, before the health maintenance organization provides
15	coverage	for the recommended prescription drug."
16	SECT	ION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
17	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
18	begun bef	ore its effective date.
19	SECT	ION 7. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECT	ION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

## Report Title:

Health Care Insurance; Step Therapy

## Description:

Prohibits a health care insurer, mutual benefit society, or health maintenance organization from requiring an insured, subscriber, member, or enrollee diagnosed with stage two through stage four cancer to undergo step therapy prior to covering the insured for the drug prescribed by the insured's health care provider, under certain conditions, for health insurance policies and contracts issued or renewed after 12/31/2020.
