A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SERVICE-LEARNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that learning through
- 2 volunteering activities, known as service-learning, is a
- 3 powerful instructional strategy for improving the educational
- 4 performance of students. Students who participate in
- 5 service-learning experience numerous positive outcomes,
- 6 including a positive development of character, values,
- 7 self-esteem, civic responsibility, and knowledge of local
- 8 community issues and concerns; higher academic achievement;
- 9 higher attendance rates; a greater sense of civic
- 10 responsibility; greater acceptance of cultural diversity;
- 11 increased awareness of cultural difference; positive attitudes
- 12 toward helping others; greater social competency; lower dropout
- 13 rates; lower disciplinary rates; and lower rates of engagement
- 14 in behaviors that lead to arrest or pregnancy. Community
- 15 leaders report that service-learning partnerships help to build
- 16 positive community attitudes toward youth. In addition, schools

- 1 that support service-learning are more likely to have positive
- 2 relationships within their communities.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to require public schools to
- 4 implement a service-learning curriculum.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by adding a new section to part II, subpart C, to be
- 7 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 8 "§302A- (a) No later than the 2023-2024 school year,
- 9 the department shall implement a service-learning curriculum for
- 10 students in grades nine through twelve. The service-learning
- 11 curriculum shall be approved by the board. The purpose of the
- 12 curriculum shall be to develop character, values, self-esteem,
- 13 civic responsibility, and knowledge of local community issues
- 14 and concerns through community service volunteer work.
- 15 Completion of the service-learning curriculum shall be a
- 16 requirement for graduation.
- 17 (b) The service-learning curriculum shall:
- 18 (1) Specify a minimum number of hours of community service
- volunteer work that must be completed by each student;
- 20 (2) Include evidence-based and applied instructional
- 21 practices for developing service-learning skills;

1	<u>(3)</u>	Identify the ways that the curriculum aligns with and
2		is supportive of common core state standards;
3	(4)	Require students to learn and develop through active
4		participation in thoughtfully organized service that
5		shall:
6		(A) Be conducted in, and meets the needs of, a
7		community;
8		(B) Be coordinated with a secondary school and with
9		the community; and
10		(C) Help foster civic responsibility;
11	<u>(5)</u>	Be integrated into and enhance the standards-based
12		academic curriculum of students;
13	(6)	Provide structured time for students to reflect on
14		their volunteer experience;
15	(7)	Provide model lessons and activities specific to each
16		grade level; and
17	(8)	Identify supporting instructional materials.
18	<u>(c)</u>	The service-learning curriculum shall be posted on the
19	departmen	t's website. The website shall also encourage private
20	schools a	nd charter schools to follow the service-learning
21	curriculu	m."

- 1 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
