A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAYS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a
- 2 considerable and uncatalogued number of public highways in the
- 3 State whose ownership, as between the State and the counties, is
- 4 in dispute. Many disputed roads are not maintained on a regular
- 5 basis, and a great expense will be involved in upgrading,
- 6 repairing, and maintaining them, as well as performing full
- 7 metes and bounds surveys of them.
- 8 The legislature further finds that between 1892 and 1947,
- 9 all public roads were owned by the Kingdom of Hawaii (later, the
- 10 Territory of Hawaii) and were labeled "public highways." By
- 11 1913, the counties were maintaining all of these public
- 12 highways. In 1941, the obligation to maintain the Hawaiian home
- 13 lands roads was given to the counties through the State
- 14 Constitution. In 1947, the category of "public highways" was
- 15 divided into two: one was territorial or federal-aid highways,
- 16 which were all the highways under the jurisdiction of the
- 17 territorial highway engineer or the superintendent of public

- 1 works (later, the department of transportation); and the other
- 2 was county highways. And the counties' duty to maintain all
- 3 public highways was reduced to maintaining only the county
- 4 highways and the department of Hawaiian home lands roads.
- 5 However, although certain roads were now denominated county
- 6 roads, ownership of all public highways remained with the
- 7 Territory (later, the State).
- 8 The legislature further finds that in 1963, the legislature
- 9 gave the counties ownership of all county roads obtained by
- 10 eminent domain, purchase, dedication, or surrender. In 1965,
- 11 the legislature amended the 1963 statute to attempt to transfer
- 12 to the counties ownership of all county roads. In 1966, the
- 13 legislature enacted an urgency measure allowing the governor to
- 14 force ownership of a road on a county through an executive
- 15 order. However, the counties refused to cooperate with this
- 16 series of statutes.
- 17 The legislature further finds that as recently as September
- 18 2019, the proper jurisdiction over the Maunakea access road fell
- 19 under question when a state senator argued that the department
- 20 of Hawaiian home lands may not have properly transferred
- 21 jurisdiction over the road to the department of transportation.

1	The p	purpose of this Act is to establish the old government
2	roads com	mission to assist in resolving disputes between the
3	State and	the counties relating to jurisdiction over old
4	governmen	t roads by, among other things, drafting memoranda of
5	agreement	between the State and the counties to provide for the
6	repair of	old government roads, bring them up to county
7	standards	, and transfer their ownership to the counties.
8	SECT	ION 2. (a) The old government roads commission is
9	establish	ed within the department of transportation for
10	administra	ative purposes. The commission shall have the
11	following	duties:
12	(1)	Identify and develop an inventory of all disputed
13		government roads;
14	(2)	Create a priority list of roads that require more
15		immediate attention than other roads based upon the
16		condition of the roads and the volume of traffic on
17		the roads;
18	(3)	Draft and execute memoranda of agreement between the
19		State and each county that requires the State to
20		transfer title of ownership of a disputed road to the

1		county once the State repairs the road and brings it
2		up to county standards;
3	(4)	Establish a system for repairing disputed roads, which
4		includes creating a new budget line item for the
5		department of transportation to design, plan, and
6		construct a particular road that the commission deems
7		a priority under paragraph (2); and
8	(5)	Explore the possibility of accessing federal funds to
9		alleviate the costs of repairing roads of which
10		ownership is disputed.
11	(b)	The old government roads commission shall consist of
12	the follo	wing persons or their designee:
13	(1)	The director of transportation who shall serve as co-
14		chairperson;
15	(2)	The chairperson of the senate committee on ways and
16		means;
17	(3)	The chairperson of the house of representatives
18		committee on finance;
19	(4)	The chairperson of the senate committee on
20		transportation

1	(5)	The charryerson of the house of representatives
2		committee on transportation;
3	(6)	The attorney general;
4	(7)	The mayor of each county who shall serve as a co-
5		chairperson for any item on a meeting agenda relating
6		to a road situated in that mayor's county;
7	(8)	The corporation counsel or county attorney of each
8		county; and
9	(9)	The director or county engineer of public works or
10		design and construction of each county.
11	(c)	No commission member designated in subsection (b)(7),
12	(8), or (9) may vote on a matter that does not relate to a road
13	located in	n the county represented by the member.
14	(d)	A commission member designated in subsection (b)(7),
15	(8), or (9) may be excused from attending any meeting or portion
16	of a meet	ing for which the agenda does not relate to a road
17	located i	n the county represented by the member. For the
18	purpose o	f calculating a quorum, the number of members excused
19	from atte	nding a meeting or portion thereof pursuant to this
20	subsection	n shall be subtracted from the total committee
21	membershi	p.

- 1 (e) The director of transportation shall determine the
- 2 location and frequency of old government roads commission
- 3 meetings; provided that the commission shall meet no less than
- 4 twice a year.
- 5 (f) Members of the old government roads commission shall
- 6 serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
- 7 reasonable expenses incurred, including travel expenses. No
- 8 member of the commission shall be made subject to chapter 84,
- 9 Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because of that member's
- 10 participation as a member of the commission.
- 11 (g) The old government roads commission shall submit an
- 12 annual report, including findings, recommendations, and any
- 13 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
- 14 days prior to the convening of each regular session.
- 15 (h) The department of transportation shall provide
- 16 administrative and clerical support required by the commission.
- 17 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
- 20 the purposes of this Act.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020, and
- 4 shall be repealed on June 30, 2025.
