# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LONG TERM CARE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that virtually all of
- 2 Hawaii's elderly population would prefer to age-in-place at home
- 3 rather than in a care home or institution, and that many elders
- 4 will require intensive services and caregiving at the end of
- 5 their lives. The legislature passed S.B. No. 3255, S.D. 2,
- 6 H.D. 2, C.D. 1, enacted as Act 224, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008,
- 7 to address these issues. The Act established long term care
- 8 policy goals, guiding principles, and a long term care
- 9 commission to identify needed reforms of the long term care
- 10 system including a five-year plan. The long term care
- 11 commission expired in 2010.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to require the executive office
- on aging to assess progress made toward the identified policy
- 14 goals of the long term care commission and establish further
- 15 recommendations going forward to meet the goals.
- 16 SECTION 2. The executive office on aging shall:

1	(1)	Assess the progress made toward attaining the policy
2		goals identified by the long term care commission
3		pursuant to Act 224, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008;
4	(2)	Formulate recommendations to further work toward
5		meeting the policy goals; and
6	(3)	Submit a report of its findings and recommendations to
7		the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
8		convening of the 2022 regular session.
9	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
10	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
11	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for	
12	the executive office on aging to carry out the tasks set forth	
13	in section 2 of this Act.	
14	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department o	
15	health for the purposes of this Act.	
16	SECT	TON 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
