### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LONG TERM CARE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that virtually all of Hawaii's elderly population would prefer to age in place rather 2 3 than move to a care home or institution; however, many elders 4 will require intensive services and caregiving at the end of 5 their lives. Act 224, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, addressed 6 these issues by establishing long-term care policy goals, 7 guiding principles, and a long term care commission to identify 8 needed reforms of the long-term care system and to develop a 9 five-year plan. The long term care commission expired in 2010. 10 The purpose of this Act is to require the executive office 11 on aging to assess progress made toward policy goals identified 12 by the long term care commission and to make further 13 recommendations on how the State can meet these goals. 14 SECTION 2. The executive office on aging shall: 15 (1)Assess the progress made toward attaining the policy 16 goals identified by the long term care commission 17 pursuant to Act 224, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008;



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1	(2)	Formulate further recommendations on how the State can
2		meet these policy goals; and
3	(3)	Submit a report of its findings and recommendations to
4		the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
5		convening of the regular session of 2022.
6	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
7	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
8	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for	
9	the executive office on aging to carry out the tasks set forth	
10	in section 2 of this Act.	
11	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
12	health for the purposes of this Act.	

13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
