A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CESSPOOL CONVERSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that failing cesspools
- 2 are contaminating the State's ground water, streams, and coastal
- 3 ecosystems. To address this, Act 125, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 4 2017, required the replacement of all cesspools by 2050 and
- 5 directed the department of health to develop a system to
- 6 prioritize their replacement. The department of health's
- 7 December 2017 report to the legislature identified four priority
- 8 categories: priority level one for "areas where cesspools
- 9 present a significant risk of human impacts, drinking water
- 10 impacts, or draining to sensitive waters;" priority level two
- 11 for "areas where cesspools present a potential to impact
- 12 drinking water; "priority level three for "areas where cesspools
- 13 present a potential impact on sensitive waters or coastal
- 14 ecosystems;" and priority level four, which includes cesspools
- 15 where impacts have not yet been assessed. Cesspools categorized
- 16 under levels one, two, and three include approximately forty-
- 17 three thousand cesspools in the State.

2	or convert a cesspool imposes a financial burden on low- and		
3	moderate-income families.		
4	The purpose of this Act is to assist low- and moderate-		
5	income property owners with converting their failing cesspools		
6	to more environmentally appropriate systems by creating a pilot		
7	grant project to assist with conversion costs.		
8	SECTION 2. Chapter 342D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately		
10	designated and to read as follows:		
11	"§342D- Cesspool compliance pilot grant project. (a)		
12	There is established in the department the cesspool compliance		
13	pilot grant project to assist property owners with upgrading or		
14	converting a cesspool that the department has identified as		
15	failing. Specifically, the pilot project will assist property		
16	owners in meeting the costs of:		
17	(1) Upgrading or converting a failing cesspool to a seption		
18	system, aerobic treatment unit system, or other		
19	advanced treatment system approved by the department;

21	(2) Connecting a failing common to a soverage system

1	(b)	The department shall not grant awards to any owner of	
2	real prope	rty with a cesspool unless the department has assigned	
3	the cesspo	ol to priority level one, two, or three in the	
4	department	's December 2017 report to the legislature entitled	
5	"Relating	to Cesspools and Prioritization for Replacement."	
6	<u>(c)</u>	No grant under this section shall be awarded to a	
7	property o	wner of a cesspool who is:	
8	(1)	A taxpayer filing a single return or a married person	
9		filing separately with a Hawaii adjusted gross income	
10		of \$ or more;	
11	(2)	A taxpayer filing as a head of household with a Hawaii	
12		adjusted gross income of \$ or more; or	
13	(3)	A taxpayer filing a joint return or as a surviving	
14		spouse with a Hawaii adjusted gross income of \$	
15		or more.	
16	(d)	The department shall adopt rules as necessary to carry	
17	out the pi	lot grant project; provided that the rules shall	
18	include a	method of calculating a sliding scale grant amount	
19	based upon	the Hawaii adjusted gross income of the owner of the	
20	property with a failing cesspool."		

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$750,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to
- 4 implement the cesspool compliance pilot grant project; provided
- 5 that no funds shall be released unless a fifty per cent match is
- 6 provided by the relevant county; provided further that
- 7 \$ of the appropriation may be used to fund one temporary,
- 8 part-time position in the department of health for a cesspool
- 9 compliance pilot grant project administrator.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 11 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
