A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIMITED SERVICE PREGNANCY CENTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 200, Session
- 2 Laws of Hawaii 2017 (Act 200), required that limited service
- 3 pregnancy centers distribute information relating to
- 4 comprehensive family planning services, including services not
- 5 offered by the limited service pregnancy center, to their
- 6 clients or patients. Act 200 was subsequently codified as
- 7 sections 321-561 and 321-562, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 8 The legislature further finds that, in Calvary Chapel Pearl
- 9 Harbor v. Suzuki, Civil Action No. 17-00326-DKW-KSC (2018), the
- 10 United States District Court for the District of Hawaii declared
- 11 section 321-561(b) and (c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, to be
- 12 unconstitutional in light of the Supreme Court of the United
- 13 States decision in National Institute of Family and Life
- 14 Advocates v. Becerra, 138 S.Ct. 2361 (2018), and issued a
- 15 permanent injunction against enforcement of that section.
- 16 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to repeal sections
- 17 321-561 and 321-562, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

10		(B)	Collects health information from clients or

12		(C)	Provides family planning or pregnancy related

14			ultrasound, obstetric sonogram, pregnancy	
15			testing, pregnancy diagnosis, reproductive health	
16			counseling, or prenatal care; and

18		purp	oses of this paragraph, a "health care facility"	
19		mean	s any facility designed to provide comprehensive	
20		heal	th care; including but not limited to hospitals	
21		lice	ensed pursuant to chapter 321, intermediate care

2	facilities, emergency care facilities and centers,
3	health maintenance organizations, federally qualified
4	health centers, and other facilities providing
5	similarly organized comprehensive health care
6	services.
7	(b) Every limited service pregnancy center in the State
8	shall-disseminate on site to clients or patients the following
9	written notice in English or another language requested by a
10	client or patient:
11	"Hawaii has public programs that provide immediate free or
12	low-cost access to comprehensive family planning services,
13	including, but not limited to, all FDA approved methods of
14	contraception and pregnancy-related services for eligible women.
15	To apply online for medical insurance coverage, that will
16	cover the full range of family planning and prenatal care
17	services, go to mybenefits.hawaii.gov.
18	Only ultrasounds performed by qualified health care
19	professionals and read by licensed clinicians should be
20	considered medically accurate."

1	The -	notice shall contain the internet address for online
2	medical a	ssistance applications and the statewide phone number
3	for medical	al assistance applications.
4	(c)	The information required by subsection (b) shall-be
5	disclosed	in at least one of the following ways:
6	(1)	A public notice on a sign sized at least eight and
7		one half inches by eleven inches, written in no less
8		than twenty-two point type, and posted in a clear and
9		conspicuous place within the center's waiting area so
10		that it may be easily read by individuals seeking
11		services from the center; or
12	(2)	A printed or digital notice written or rendered in no
13		less than fourteen point type that is distributed
14		individually to each patient or client at the time of
15		check-in-for services; provided that a printed notice
16		shall be available to all individuals who cannot or do
17		not wish to receive the notice in a digital format.
18	(d)	No limited service pregnancy center that collects
19	health in	formation from any individual seeking or receiving its
20	services	shall disclose any individually identifiable health
21	informati	on to any other person, entity, or organization without

1	express written authorization from the subject individual. Any
2	disclosure made under this section shall be limited by the
3	express terms of the written authorization and all applicable
4	state and federal laws and regulations, including the federal
5	Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and
6	title 45 Code of Federal Regulations part 164.
7	(e) A limited service pregnancy center that provides or
8	assists in the provision of pregnancy testing shall provide the
9	individual tested with a free written statement of the results
10	of the pregnancy test in English or another language requested
11	by a client or patient immediately after the test is completed.
12	(f) Upon receipt of a written request from an individual
13	to examine or copy all or part of the individual's recorded
14	health-information or other information retained by a limited
15	service pregnancy center, the center shall, promptly as required
16	under the circumstances but in no case later than fifteen
17	working days after receiving the request:
18	(1) Make the information available for examination by the
19	individual during regular business hours;
20	(2) Provide a free copy to the individual, if requested;

1	(3)	Inform the individual if the information does not
2		exist or cannot be found; and
3	(4)	If the center does not maintain the record or
4		information, inform the individual of that fact and
5		provide the name and address of the entity that
6		maintains the record or information."]
7	SECT	ION 3. Section 321-562, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	repealed.	
9	[" [\$	321-562] Limited service pregnancy centers;
10	enforceme	nt; private right of action. (a) A limited service
11	pregnancy	center that violates section 321-561 shall be liable
12	for a civ	il penalty of \$500 for a first offense and \$1,000 for
13	each subs	equent offense. If the center is provided with
14	reasonabl	e notice of noncompliance, which informs the center
15	that it i	s subject to a civil penalty if it does not correct the
16	violation	within thirty days from the date the notice is sent to
17	the cente	r, and the violation is not corrected as of the
18	expiratio	n of the thirty-day notice period, the attorney general
19	may bring	an action in the district court of the district in
20	which the	center is located to enforce this section.

1	A civil penalty imposed pursuant to this subsection shall
2	be deposited to the credit of the general fund.
3	(b) Any person who is aggrieved by a limited service
4	pregnancy center's violation of section 321-561 may bring a
5	civil action against the limited service pregnancy center in the
6	district court of the district in which the center is located to
7	enjoin further violations and to recover actual damages
8	sustained together with the costs of the suit including
9	reasonable attorneys! fees. The court may, in its discretion,
10	increase the award of damages to an amount not to exceed three
11	times the actual damages sustained. If damages are awarded
12	pursuant to this subsection, the court may, in its discretion,
13	impose on a liable center a civil fine of not more than \$1,000
14	to be paid to the plaintiff.
15	A party seeking civil damages under this subsection may
16	recover upon proof of a violation by a preponderance of the
17	evidence.
18	For the purposes of this subsection, "person" includes a
19	natural or legal person.
20	(c) The enforcement procedure and remedies provided by
21	this section shall be in addition to any other procedure or



- 1 remedy that may be available to the State or a person aggrieved
- 2 by a violation of this chapter.
- 3 (d) This section and section 321-561 are not intended to
- 4 require regulation or oversight of limited service pregnancy
- 5 centers by the department of health."]
- 6 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
