A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL RESIDENCY PROGRAMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that stemming the
- 2 critical and growing shortage of qualified physicians in Hawaii
- 3 is a matter of statewide public concern. The lack of residency
- 4 training opportunities for local medical graduates contributes
- 5 significantly to this shortage.
- 6 Residency is a supervised, hands-on training program that
- 7 must be completed prior to licensure, board certification, and
- 8 independent practice. This course of training lasts at least
- 9 three years and exposes new doctors to varied care settings,
- 10 diverse patients, and new research methods.
- 11 The legislature further finds that, according to a recent
- 12 study at the university of Hawaii's John A. Burns school of
- 13 medicine, while medical school class sizes are increasing,
- 14 available residency positions in Hawaii are shrinking. In fact,
- 15 the State ranks in the bottom fifth for available residency
- 16 positions per graduate.

- 1 The legislature finds that federal funds support only a
- 2 small portion of the costs associated with post-graduate medical
- 3 training. The amount falls far short of what is needed to
- 4 support and expand the State's critically important residency
- 5 programs. Federal funding has also failed to keep pace with the
- 6 growing costs of medical training, placing significant financial
- 7 burdens on teaching hospitals and forcing them to limit their
- 8 residency opportunities.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to provide additional long-term
- 10 funding to Hawaii teaching hospitals to support and expand their
- 11 residency training programs.
- 12 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to support
- 15 the expansion of physician residency training programs in
- 16 Hawaii's teaching hospitals; provided that no funds shall be
- 17 released unless matched dollar-for-dollar by private funding
- 18 sources.
- 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the medical
- 20 education council in cooperation with the department of health
- 21 for the purposes of this Act.



SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020. 1
