A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to assist persons
 who have been diagnosed with autism to participate in their
 communities by providing medicaid coverage for home and
 community-based services.
 SECTION 2. This Act shall be known and may be cited as
 "Kelii's Law".

7 SECTION 3. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
9 and to read as follows:

10 "§346- Autism; coverage; home and community-based

11 services. (a) Beginning on January 1, 2020, and

12 notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the State's medicaid

13 managed care and fee-for service programs shall not deny

14 coverage for home and community-based services to individuals

15 who have been diagnosed with autism.

16 (b) Coverage under this section shall include, but not be 17 limited to coverage for:

(2) Career planning, including vocational assessment and job placement services; Community transition services; (3) (4) Day habilitation; (5) Family support; (6) Home modifications; (7) Nutritional consultation; (8) Residential habilitation; (9) Respite care; Specialized skill development, including behavioral (10) specialist, community support, and systematic skill building services; Supported employment, including extended employment (11)supports and intensive job coaching; Temporary supplemental services; (12) Therapeutic care; (13) Transitional work services; (14)(15) Vehicle modifications; Supportive housing; and (16)

Assistive technology;



1	(17) Access to the medicaid early and periodic screening,
2	diagnosis and treatment program for eligible
3	individuals under the age of twenty-one.
4	(c) Services covered pursuant to this section shall be
5	consistent with all federal and state privacy, security, and
6	confidentiality laws.
7	(d) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the
8	provisions of this section shall comply with the applicable
9	federal requirements related to utilization, coverage, and
10	reimbursement for services provided to individuals who have been
11	diagnosed with autism.
12	(e) As used in this section, unless the context clearly
13	requires otherwise:
14	"Autism" means autism spectrum disorder, which is a
15	neurodevelopmental disorder, as defined by the most recent
16	edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental
17	Disorders.
18	"Therapeutic care" means services provided by licensed
19	speech pathologists, licensed psychiatrists, licensed
20	psychologists, registered occupational therapists, licensed

1 social workers, licensed clinical social workers, or licensed
2 physical therapists."

3 SECTION 4. The department of human services shall seek a 4 waiver pursuant to section 1115 of the Social Security Act, 5 title 42 United States Code section 1315, and other approvals 6 from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that may be 7 necessary to amend the state medicaid plan to provide home and 8 community-based services for medicaid eligible individuals who 9 have been diagnosed with autism.

SECTION 5. The provision of home and community-based services for individuals diagnosed with autism as required by this Act shall apply to all plans issued under medicaid managed care and fee-for-service programs in the State.

SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun before its effective date.

17 SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act, or the 18 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held 19 invalid by state or federal law, the invalidity does not affect 20 other provisions or applications of the Act that can be given

effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
 end the provisions of this Act are severable.

3 SECTION 8. New statutory material is underscored.

4 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 5 provided that section 5 shall take effect upon approval of the 6 1115 waiver by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services 7 submitted pursuant to section 4 of this Act.
