A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHOTOVOLTAIC ENERGY SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 196, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 Photovoltaic energy system required for new 5 single-family residential construction. (a) On or after 6 January 1, 2025, no building permit shall be issued for a new 7 single-family dwelling that does not include a photovoltaic 8 energy system that meets the standards established pursuant to 9 section 269- , unless the chief energy officer of the Hawaii 10 state energy office approves a variance. A variance application 11 shall only be accepted if submitted by an architect or 12 mechanical engineer licensed under chapter 464, who attests 13 that: 14 (1) Installation is impracticable due to poor solar 15 resource; 16 (2) Installation is cost-prohibitive based upon a life 17 cycle cost-benefit analysis that incorporates the

2		new photovoltaic energy system with a life cycle that
3		does not exceed fifteen years; or
4	(3)	A renewable energy technology system, as defined in
5		section 235-12.5, is substituted for use as the
6		primary energy source.
7	<u>(b)</u>	A request for a variance shall be submitted to the
8	chief ene	rgy officer of the Hawaii state energy office on an
9	applicati	on prescribed by the chief energy officer of the Hawaii
10	state energy office and shall include a description of the	
11	location	of the property and justification for the approval of a
12	variance	using the criteria established in subsection (a). A
13	variance	shall be deemed approved if not denied within thirty
14	working d	ays after receipt of the variance application. The
15	chief energy officer of the Hawaii state energy office shall	
16	publicize:	
17	(1)	All applications for a variance within seven days
18		after receipt of the variance application; and
19	(2)	The disposition of all applications for a variance
20		within seven days of the determination of the variance

(c) The director of business, economic development, and 1 tourism may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to impose and 2 collect fees to cover the costs of administering variances under 3 this section. The fees, if any, shall be deposited into the 4 energy security special fund established under section 201-12.8. 5 6 Nothing in this section shall preclude any county from (d) establishing procedures and standards required to implement this 7 8 section. 9 (e) Nothing in this section shall preclude participation 10 in any utility demand-side management program or public benefits 11 fee program under part VII of chapter 269." SECTION 2. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 13 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 14 and to read as follows: "§269- Photovoltaic energy system standards. Not later 15 16 than July 1, 2024, or as soon as reasonably practicable, the 17 public utilities commission shall adopt or establish by rule, 18 tariff, or order, standards for photovoltaic energy systems to 19 include, but not be limited to specifications for the performance, materials, components, durability, longevity, 20

- proper sizing, installation, and quality to promote the 1
- objectives of section 269-124." 2
- SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. 3
- SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
