A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that homelessness 2 continues to be one of the State's most significant and 3 challenging social problems. Although the 2018 Hawaii statewide 4 homeless point-in-time count conducted in January 2018 found 5 that there are 6,530 homeless individuals in the State, an 6 overall decrease of 9.6 per cent from 2017, the costs of caring 7 for this population have continued to grow. Many homeless 8 persons face a wide range of challenges, including general 9 health issues, mental illness, and substance abuse issues. 10 These problems affecting homeless persons also impact the 11 general population through the costs of social and health care 12 services. In 2016, homeless persons in the State made more than 13 twenty thousand hospital visits. In 2016, state hospitals 14 billed \$214,000,000 in charges for caring for the homeless, up 15 drastically from \$70,500,000 in 2010. Treatment for these 16 homeless individuals is sometimes uncompensated; one hospital



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alone estimates it incurs more than \$10,000,000 in uncompensated
 costs annually.

3 The legislature also finds that mobile clinics have become increasingly popular across the nation as state governments try 4 5 to find ways to address the health care needs of homeless 6 populations. In places like Dallas, Texas; Denver, Colorado; 7 San Jose, California; and Seattle, Washington, mobile clinics 8 offer a variety of free health care services for local homeless 9 populations, resulting in significant cost savings when compared 10 to emergency room visits. One estimate from 2016 found that 11 each dollar spent on mobile clinics saved twelve dollars in 12 other costs.

13 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for 14 purchasing, staffing, and operating two mobile clinics to serve 15 homeless individuals; provided that one of the mobile clinics 16 shall be allocated to the county with the largest land mass. 17 SECTION 2. The department of human services shall

18 establish and operate two mobile clinics to serve homeless 19 individuals; provided that:

20 (1) One mobile clinic shall be allocated to the county
21 with the largest land mass;



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1	(2)	No funds shall be made available under this Act unless
2		the department of human services first obtains
3		matching funds on a dollar-for-dollar basis to the
4		amount appropriated by the State;
5	(3)	Mobile clinic staff may include a primary care
6		provider, a nurse, a pharmacist, a psychiatrist, a
7		social worker, an outreach worker, students pursuing
8		degrees in medicine or nursing, and other staff as
9		needed; and
10	(4)	The mobile clinics shall provide, at a minimum, the
11		following services:
12		(A) Non-emergency medical services for chronic,
13		acute, and episodic conditions;
14		(B) Testing for sexually transmitted disease, human
15		immunodeficiency virus, and hepatitis;
16		(C) Family planning;
17		(D) Child and family services;
18		(E) Behavioral health and substance abuse services;
19		(F) Mental health services;
20		(G) Dental care;
21		(H) Referral services;



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1	(I)	Shower and laundry services;		
2	(J)	Clean clothing;		
3	(K)	Health insurance enrollment;		
4	(L)	Pharmacy services;		
5	(M)	Street medicine; provided that for the purposes		
6		of this subparagraph, "street medicine" means the		
7		practice of directly delivering health care and		
8		related services to unsheltered homeless persons;		
9		and		
10	(N)	Other assistance services.		
11	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general			
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much			
13	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to			
14	purchase, staff, and operate two mobile clinics to serve			
15	homeless individuals pursuant to this Act.			
16	The sum a	opropriated shall be expended by the department of		
17	human services for the purposes of this Act.			
18	SECTION 4	. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
