## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BROADBAND SERVICE INFRASTRUCTURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the economic and
 business incentives to deploy broadband infrastructure may be
 insufficient to economically justify providing full access to
 broadband services in low-density, rural locations and other
 unserved and underserved areas of the State where the unit costs
 of providing service may not provide an adequate return on
 investment.

8 Economically feasible deployment of infrastructure for 9 high-speed broadband across the State, especially to low 10 population density areas, presents a more formidable challenge 11 than faced by most states, which are part of one continental 12 land mass, because the unique geography of our State prevents 13 the use of less costly options for connectivity.

Access to broadband services in unserved and underserved areas in Hawaii would enhance economic development, education, health care, and emergency services in the State. The availability of grants for deployment to unserved and



underserved areas would further those objectives by encouraging
 new investment in broadband infrastructure.

3 The legislature strongly supports efforts to improve access
4 to broadband services for residents across the State and efforts
5 that benefit consumers and businesses in accessing services.

6 Although broadband coverage in the State is widespread,

7 additional investment can be made to keep up with needs in rural8 communities to bridge the digital divide.

9 The purpose of this Act is to facilitate the deployment of 10 broadband infrastructure in unserved and underserved areas of 11 Hawaii by identifying and addressing remaining obstacles to full 12 deployment of broadband infrastructure to all areas of Hawaii. 13 Specifically, this Act establishes the broadband infrastructure 14 grant program to award grants to applicants to extend deployment 15 of facilities used to provide broadband service to unserved and 16 underserved areas of the State.

SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
as follows:

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#### BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT PROGRAM

"CHAPTER



1 -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the S 2 context requires otherwise: 3 "Broadband infrastructure" shall have the same meaning as 4 in section 440J-1. "Broadband service" shall have the same meaning as 5 6 "broadband access or broadband service" in section 440J-1. 7 "Department" means the department of business, economic 8 development, and tourism. "Program" means the broadband infrastructure grant program 9 10 established by this chapter. 11 "Project" means a proposed deployment of broadband 12 infrastructure set forth in an application for grant funding 13 authorized under this chapter. 14 "Project area" means a census block or aggregation of 15 adjacent census blocks proposed to be covered in an application 16 for grant funding authorized under this chapter. 17 "Underserved area" means a project area with access to 18 broadband service that the minimum upload and download speeds 19 are less than double the minimum upload and download speeds 20 required for broadband service.

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"Unserved area" means a project area without access to
 broadband service.

3 S -2 Establishment of the broadband infrastructure grant program. There is established the broadband infrastructure 4 5 grant program to be placed in the department of business, 6 economic development, and tourism for administrative purposes. 7 The department shall receive and review grant applications and 8 may award grants for eligible projects pursuant to the program. 9 -3 Eligible projects. The department may award grants S 10 for eligible projects; provided that on the date the application 11 is submitted, the area to be served by the project shall be an 12 unserved area or underserved area; provided further that no 13 funds may be used to support any project involving the upgrade 14 of an existing broadband plant by an applicant.

15 § -4 Eligible applicants. To be eligible for a grant,
16 an applicant shall:

17 (1) Commit to paying a minimum of twenty per cent of the
18 project costs out of the applicant's own funds and
19 shall not provide a minimum matching amount from any
20 funds derived from federal or state government grants,
21 loans, or subsidies;



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1 (2)Be any non-governmental entity with demonstrated 2 experience in providing broadband service, broadband 3 infrastructure, or other communication services to 4 residential customers within the State; and 5 Commit to complying with net neutrality principles as (3) 6 defined by Executive Order No. 18-02. 7 S -5 Applications. (a) The department shall establish 8 an annual time period to commence an open process for submission 9 of applications for funding under the program. The time period 10 for submission shall be not less than sixty and not more than 11 ninety days. 12 The form of the application shall be as prescribed by (b) 13 the department and require submission of the following: 14 (1)Evidence demonstrating the applicant's experience and 15 ability in building, operating, and managing broadband 16 infrastructure serving residential customers; 17 (2) A description of the project area, including a list of 18 census blocks covered by the proposed deployment. Ιf 19 a census block included in a project is partially 20 served by a provider of broadband service, the 21 application shall include:

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1		(A)	A description of the portions of the census block
2			that are served;
3		(B)	A description of the portions of the census block
4			that constitute an unserved area or underserved
5			area; and
6		(C)	A certification that no portion of the grant
7			provided by the program for the project shall be
8			used to extend or deploy facilities to any
9			already-served households;
10	(3)	A de	scription of the broadband infrastructure that is
11		prop	osed to be deployed, including facilities,
12		equi	pment, and network capabilities, including minimum
13		spee	d thresholds;
14	(4)	Evid	ence, including certification from the applicant,
15		demo	nstrating the unserved or underserved nature of
16		the	project area;
17	(5)	The	number of households in each:
18		(A)	Unserved area that would gain access to broadband
19			service; and
20		(B)	Underserved area that would gain access to
21			broadband service with minimum upload and



1		download speeds that are equal to or more than
2		double the minimum upload and download speeds
3		required for broadband service,
4		as a result of the grant;
5	(6)	The total cost of the project and the timeframe in
6		which it will be completed;
7	(7)	The amount of matching funds the applicant proposes to
8		contribute and a certification that no portion of the
9		matching funds are derived from any federal or state
10		government grants, loans, or subsidies;
11	(8)	Evidence demonstrating the economic and commercial
12		feasibility of the project;
13	(9)	A list of all government authorizations, permits, and
14		other approvals required for the project and a
15		timetable for the applicant's acquisition of the
16		approvals; and
17	(10)	Any other information required by the department.
18	S	-6 Review of applications; approval. (a) Within five
19	business	days following the last day of the time period for
20	submissic	on of applications, the department shall make the

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applications available for review in a publicly available
 electronic file.

3 (b) A broadband service provider that provides service
4 within or directly adjacent to a proposed project area may
5 submit, within forty-five days of the department making the
6 applications available for review in a publicly available
7 electronic file, a written challenge to any application. The
8 challenge may:

9 (1) Dispute an applicant's certification that a proposed 10 project area is an unserved area or underserved area, 11 or that no other federal or state programs provide 12 funding that is available to the applicant for a 13 project for which program support is sought; or 14 Attest to the challenging provider's existing or (2) 15 planned provision of broadband service within the 16 applicant's proposed project area.

17 (c) In reviewing applications, and any accompanying
18 challenge, the department shall review the proposed project
19 areas to ensure that all awarded funds are used to deploy
20 broadband infrastructure to unserved areas or underserved areas.

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1	(d)	The department shall award grants for projects set
2	forth in	applications based upon a scoring system that shall be
3	released	to the public at least thirty days prior to the first
4	day of th	e time period for submission of applications. The
5	scoring s	ystem shall give the highest weight or priority to the
6	specific	criteria enumerated as follows:
7	(1)	Larger unserved area or underserved area proposed to
8		be served;
9	(2)	Applicants with more experience and technical ability
10		to successfully deploy and provide broadband service
11		and more financial resources available to finance the
12		project;
13	(3)	Projects in which fewer government funds and less
14		support are necessary to deploy broadband
15		infrastructure in an economically feasible manner;
16	(4)	Projects with more matching funds proposed to be
17		committed by the applicant;
18	(5)	Projects in unserved areas, rather than those in
19		underserved areas;
20	(6)	High service speed thresholds proposed in the
21		application and high scalability of the broadband

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1		infrastructure proposed to be deployed to speeds more
2		than the minimum upload and download speeds required
3		for broadband service;
4	(7)	Applicants with a high ability to leverage nearby or
5		adjacent broadband infrastructure to facilitate the
6		proposed deployment and provision of service to
7		households;
8	(8)	Projects that do not duplicate any existing broadband
9		infrastructure in the project area; and
10	(9)	Other factors the department determines to be
11		reasonable and appropriate, consistent with the
12		purpose of facilitating the economic deployment of
13		broadband infrastructure to unserved and underserved
14		areas.
15	(e)	Each grant award shall include a reasonable timeframe
16	to comple	te the project.
17	§	-7 Departmental authority. The department may:
18	(1)	Require disgorgement of grant funds in response to an
19		applicant's pattern of failure, following notice and
20		an opportunity to cure and build-out a project area in

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1 accordance with the timeframes and milestones set 2 forth in its application; 3 Consider an applicant's financial ability to complete (2) 4 the project proposed in an application and make 5 reasonable requests for information necessary for the 6 oversight and administration of any project funded 7 pursuant to this chapter; and 8 Impose any new or additional regulatory requirements (3) 9 on grant recipients, through grant agreements or any 10 other mechanism, other than the program implementation 11 rules expressly authorized in this chapter. 12 The department shall adopt rules S -8 Rules. (a) 13 pursuant to chapter 91 to effectuate the purposes of this 14 chapter. 15 (b) The rules shall: 16 Include reasonable oversight and reporting provisions (1) 17 to ensure that grant moneys are used as intended; and 18 (2) Not impose any financial penalty or liquidated damages 19 provisions, or provisions that are not reasonably 20 related to the deployment of broadband infrastructure 21 on the State in accordance with this chapter."



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1 SECTION 3. Within one hundred eighty days of the approval 2 of this Act, the department of business, economic development, 3 and tourism shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to implement the broadband infrastructure 4 5 grant program including rules regarding the submission, review, 6 and approval of applications; administration of projects funded; 7 and grant agreements memorializing the award of funds. 8 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the 11 establishment and administration of the broadband infrastructure 12 grant program established by this Act. 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 14 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of 15 this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;provided that section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
