A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ACUPUNCTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many statutes concerning the practice of acupuncture in the State have not 2 been updated in over twenty years. To strengthen and modernize 3 the acupuncture industry in the State to best serve patients 4 5 with various conditions, existing law must be updated to accurately reflect the profession's modalities. Therefore, the 6 purpose of this Act is to amend and update certain statutes 7 8 concerning the practice of acupuncture. 9 SECTION 2. Section 436E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 10 "[+]§436E-1[+] Declaration of necessity for regulation and 11 12 control. The legislature hereby finds and declares that the 13 practice of acupuncture is a [theory and method for] medical

14 treatment system supported by evidence-based medicine and

15 evidence-informed practice. Acupuncture is used in the

16 treatment of illness [and], disability, and [for strengthening

17 and invigorating the body] the prevention of disease, and as

such affects the public health, safety, and welfare, and 1 therefore there is a necessity that individuals practicing 2 acupuncture be subject to regulation and control." 3 SECTION 3. Section 436E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending the definition of "practice of acupuncture" 5 6 to read as follows: ""Practice of acupuncture" means stimulation of a certain 7 acupuncture point or points or areas on the [human-body for the 8 purpose of controlling and regulating] patient to restore and 9 regulate the flow and balance of energy [in the body.] and 10 11 homeostasis in the patient. [The practice includes the techniques of piercing the skin by inserting needles and point 12 stimulation by the use of acupressure, electrical, mechanical, 13 thermal, or traditional therapeutic means.] This medical 14 therapy includes examination, diagnosis, and treatment of a 15 16 patient using the invasive procedure of piercing the skin by inserting needles into the patient. "Practice of acupuncture" 17 18 includes, but is not limited to, auricular therapy, scalp, dry needling acupuncture, and other procedures as determined by the 19 board. "Practice of acupuncture" also includes non-invasive 20

procedures such as acupressure, electrical, mechanical, thermal, 1 and traditional therapeutic means." 2 SECTION 4. Section 436E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 "§436E-5 Qualifications for [examination.] licensure. (a) 5 No person shall be licensed to practice acupuncture unless the 6 7 person has [passed an examination and has] been found to have the necessary qualifications as prescribed in the rules adopted 8 9 by the board pursuant to chapter 91. 10 (b) Examinations and educational requirements for new licenses shall be managed, verified, and administered by the 11 National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental 12 13 Medicine in accordance with standards adopted by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine, 14 15 or their successor entities. 16 [(b) Prior to September 1, 2000, and except as provided in subsection (c), before] (c) Before any applicant shall be 17 eligible for [the examination,] licensure, the applicant shall 18 19 furnish satisfactory proof to the board that the applicant has 20 received [a total of not less than one thousand five hundred 21 hours of] education and training consisting of:

transcripts and curriculum evaluated by a board approved and 1 designated professional evaluator who shall make a determination 2 whether the transcripts and curriculum are at least equivalent 3 to that of the United States accredited acupuncture program, and 4 that the foreign institute is licensed, approved, or accredited 5 6 by the appropriate governmental authority or an agency recognized by a governmental authority in the respective foreign 7 jurisdiction and whose curriculum is approved by the board." 8 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 9 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020. 11
