A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 206M, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding two new parts to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . DIVISION OF AEROSPACE DEVELOPMENT
- 5 §206M- Definitions. As used in this part:
- 6 "Director" means the director of the division of aerospace
- 7 development.
- 8 "Division" means the division of aerospace development.
- 9 §206M- Division of aerospace development; establishment;
- 10 director. (a) There is established within the Hawaii
- 11 technology development corporation a division of aerospace
- 12 development.
- 13 (b) The division shall be headed by a director, who shall
- 14 be appointed by, and serve at the pleasure of the board. The
- 15 director shall have experience, knowledge, and expertise in
- 16 space-related activities and development.

1	(c)	The director may hire staff necessary to carry out the
2	purposes c	of this part.
3	(d)	The director and employees of the office shall be
4	exempt fro	m chapter 76 but shall be included in any benefit
5	program ge	enerally applicable to the officers and employees of
6	the State.	
7	§206M	I- Hawaii unmanned aerial systems test site;
8	administra	tor. (a) The director shall manage the operations of
9	Hawaii's u	inmanned aerial systems test site as its administrator.
10	The direct	or shall:
11	(1)	Monitor, oversee, and recommend operations of unmanned
12		aerial systems test site activities;
13	(2)	Facilitate opportunities for public and private use of
14		unmanned aerial systems test site facilities;
15	(3)	Assist unmanned aerial systems test ranges;
16	(4)	Leverage aerospace and related technological
17		capabilities in the State's academic, public, and
18		private sectors to support testing and evaluation at
19		Hawaii's unmanned aerial systems test ranges;
20	(5)	Promote innovative education and workforce development
21		programs to enhance public awareness of the benefits

1		and opportunities that unmanned aerial systems
2		technologies and applications can bring to the State;
3	(6)	Monitor national and global trends in unmanned aerial
4		systems development and testing, and recommend
5		policies and programs to advance unmanned aerial
6		systems testing in Hawaii;
7	(7)	Establish and maintain a public website with updated
8		information on the program and provide information on
9		the Hawaii unmanned aerial systems test site
10		initiative;
11	(8)	Contract for services and implement agreements,
12		subject to chapter 103D, as may be necessary to
13		conduct operations at Hawaii's unmanned aerial systems
14		test ranges;
15	(9)	Serve as Hawaii's representative on the Pan-Pacific
16		Unmanned Aerial Systems Test Range Complex management
17		team; and
18	(10)	Submit an annual report to the legislature no later
19		than twenty days prior to the convening of each
20		regular session, which shall include the status of

1		work, expenditures, and trends regarding Hawaii's
2		unmanned aerial systems test site.
3	(b)	The director may employ one administrative assistant
4	for Hawai	i's unmanned aerial systems test site operations and
5	activitie	s.
6	§206	M- Powers and duties of director. In addition to
7	any other	powers and duties provided in this part, the director
8	shall:	,
9	(1)	Oversee, supervise, and direct the planning,
10		evaluation, and coordination of space-related
11		activities, and identify and promote opportunities for
12		expanding and diversifying aerospace-related
13		industries in the State;
14	(2)	Initiate discussions for private and international
15		involvement in space-related activities in the State;
16	(3)	Assist the University of Hawaii, local companies,
17		research institutions, and other interested
18		organizations to establish partnerships with
19		corporate, government, and university entities that
20		can promote and enhance the State's aerospace
21		industry; and where possible, help to generate

1		additional revenue for the University of Hawaii and
2		create classes and other educational opportunities for
3		students;
4	(4)	Work with local universities and community colleges to
5		facilitate internships for students with associated
6		companies;
7	(5)	Work with the University of Hawaii on course
8		development, teaching, workforce development, and
9		outreach;
10	(6)	Leverage aerospace and related technological
11		capabilities in the State's academic, public, and
12		private sectors to enhance the State's ability to
13		procure federal and private research and development
14		grants and increase the State's competitiveness in
15		national and global aerospace markets;
16	(7)	Promote innovative educational and workforce
17		development programs that will enhance public
18		awareness of the State's aerospace potential and
19		enable residents to pursue employment in Hawaii's
20		aerospace industry;

1	(8)	Monitor national and global trends in the aerospace
2		industry and recommend programs and policies that can
3		support aerospace industry development statewide;
4	(9)	Review the effectiveness of present publications,
5		pamphlets, and other sources of information about
6		Hawaii's space-related activities produced and
7		distributed by the State;
8	(10)	Serve as a clearinghouse for information on Hawaii's
9		space-related activities, including but not be limited
10		to those of the University of Hawaii and federal
11		agencies located in Hawaii;
12	(11)	Target existing businesses that can provide products
13		or services of importance to the space industry to
14		support the expansion of these businesses in Hawaii;
15	(12)	Increase contact and maintain liaison with the
16		National Aeronautics and Space Administration and
17		other federal agencies and facilities;
18	(13)	Institute procedures by which citizen input on
19		proposed space facilities development shall be invited
20		at the earliest possible time in the development
21		process;

1	(14)	Pursue projects in the aerospace sector that can be
2		leveraged for improvements to the State's broadband
3		and alternative energy capabilities;
4	(15)	Maintain and expand liaisons with local businesses and
5		citizen groups;
6	(16)	Serve as the administrator for the unmanned aerial
7		systems test site;
8	(17)	Adopt, amend, and repeal rules pursuant to chapter 91
9		necessary to carry out this part;
10	(18)	Contract for services as may be necessary for the
11		purposes of this part; and
12	(19)	Do all other things necessary or proper to carry out
13		the purposes of this part.
14	§2061	M- Space vehicles; prohibitions. Any vehicle
15	launched :	into space from the land or ocean territory of the
16	State sha	ll not carry weapons of destruction, nuclear waste
17	materials	, or use radioactive materials as a power source.
18	§2061	M- Division of aerospace development special fund.
19	(a) There	e is established in the state treasury the division of
20	aerospace	development special fund, into which shall be
21	deposited	:

1	(1)	Revenues, moneys, and fees from services, rentals,
2		publications, royalties, and patents generated under
3		this part;
4	(2)	Gifts, donations, and grants received by the division;
5		and
6	(3)	Proceeds from revenue bonds issued by the director of
7		finance.
8	(b)	Moneys in the fund shall be used by the division for
9	the operat	tion, maintenance, and management of its projects,
10	facilities	s, services, and publications and for the design and
11	construct	ion of new facilities and the renovation of or addition
12	to existing	ng facilities.
13	(c)	All moneys remaining in the division of aerospace
14	developmer	nt special fund at the close of each fiscal year that
15	are deemed	d, by the director of finance, to be in excess of the
16	moneys nec	cessary to carry out the purposes of this section in
17	the next f	fiscal year shall lapse to the credit of the state
18	general fu	and.
19		PART . HAWAII BROADBAND OFFICE

§206M- Definitions. As used in this part:

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- 1 "Broadband" means high-speed internet access that is always
- 2 on, including mobile and fixed technologies.
- 3 "Corporation" means the Hawaii technology development
- 4 corporation.
- 5 "Office" means the Hawaii broadband office.
- 6 §206M- Hawaii broadband office; establishment; state
- 7 broadband strategy officer; staff. (a) There is established
- 8 the Hawaii broadband office within the Hawaii technology
- 9 development corporation.
- 10 (b) The chief executive officer of the Hawaii technology
- 11 development corporation shall appoint, exempt from chapter 76, a
- 12 state broadband strategy officer to head the office. The
- 13 corporation shall employ any staff as may be necessary for the
- 14 purposes of this part; provided that any staff employed pursuant
- 15 to this section shall be exempt from chapter 76.
- 16 §206M- Hawaii broadband office; duties. In furtherance
- 17 of the State's objectives and policies for the economy pursuant
- 18 to section 226-10.5, the office shall:
- 19 (1) Develop and implement specific strategies and plans to
- 20 aggressively increase broadband affordability,

1		penetration, and competitive availability in the
2		State;
3	(2)	Support the efforts of both public and private
4		entities in Hawaii to enhance or facilitate the
5		deployment of and access to competitively priced,
6		advanced electronic communications services, including
7		broadband and its products and services and internet
8		access services of general application throughout
9		Hawaii;
10	(3)	Promote the landing of trans-Pacific submarine cable,
11		including the development of a shared access cable
12		station and associated terrestrial connectivity to
13		reduce barriers to fiber landing in Hawaii;
14	(4)	Promote, advocate, and facilitate the implementation
15		of the findings and recommendations of the Hawaii
16		broadband task force established by Act 2, First
17		Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2007; and
18	(5)	Actively seek out funding from private and public
19		sources in furtherance of the office's duties pursuant
20		to this chapter.
21	§206	M- Broadband planning and coordination; cooperation.



- 1 (a) The office shall:
- 2 (1) Seek input and the widest possible cooperation from
- 3 public and private agencies and individuals to achieve
- 4 the purposes of this chapter;
- 5 (2) Promote coordinated broadband planning; and
- 6 (3) To the extent feasible, incorporate the ideas and
- suggestions of broadband stakeholders in the office's
- 8 planning directives.
- 9 (b) Nothing in this part shall be construed to delegate or
- 10 detract in any way from the functions, powers, and duties
- 11 conferred by law or rule on any department or agency of the
- 12 State or county."
- SECTION 2. Chapter 201, part V, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 14 is repealed.
- 15 SECTION 3. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of
- 16 the office of aerospace development and Pacific international
- 17 space center for exploration systems are transferred to the
- 18 division of aerospace development within the Hawaii technology
- 19 development corporation.
- 20 All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose
- 21 functions are transferred to the division of aerospace



- 1 development by this Act shall retain their civil service status,
- 2 whether permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred
- 3 without loss of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by
- 4 applicable collective bargaining agreements), retention points,
- 5 prior service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits
- 6 previously earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges,
- 7 in accordance with state personnel laws and this Act; provided
- 8 that the employees possess the minimum qualifications and public
- 9 employment requirements for the class or position to which
- 10 transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that
- 11 subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to applicable
- 12 civil service and compensation laws.
- Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil
- 14 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may
- 15 retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed
- 16 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An
- 17 exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer
- 18 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits
- 19 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a
- 20 consequence of this Act; provided that the employees possess
- 21 legal and public employment requirements for the position to


- 1 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further
- 2 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to
- 3 applicable employment and compensation laws. The director of
- 4 division of aerospace development may prescribe the duties and
- 5 qualifications of these employees and fix their salaries without
- 6 regard to chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes. A transferred
- 7 employee shall retain their job title or as close thereto that
- 8 reflects their position after transfer.
- 9 SECTION 4. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 10 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 11 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 12 acquired, or held by the office of aerospace development and
- 13 Pacific international space center for exploration systems
- 14 relating to the functions transferred to the division of
- 15 aerospace development within the Hawaii technology development
- 16 corporation shall be transferred with the functions to which
- 17 they relate.
- 18 SECTION 5. All unencumbered and unexpended moneys
- 19 remaining on balance at the close of June 30, 2020, in the
- 20 Pacific international space center for exploration systems
- 21 special fund established under section 201-80.2, Hawaii Revised



- 1 Statutes, as that section read on the day prior to the effective
- 2 date of this Act, shall be transferred to the credit of the
- 3 division of aerospace development special fund established in
- 4 section 1 of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
- 8 the creation and staffing of the Hawaii broadband office,
- 9 including the establishment of three full-time equivalent (3.00
- 10 FTE) positions that are exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii Revised
- 11 Statutes.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 13 technology development corporation for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 15 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 16 begun before its effective date.
- 17 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Report Title:

Hawaii Technology Development Corporation; Division of Aerospace Development; Established; Office of Aerospace Development; Pacific International Space Center for Exploration Systems; Transfer; Hawaii Broadband Office; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes the division of aerospace development within the Hawaii technology development corporation to grow investments and job opportunities in the aerospace industry and for workforce development. Transfers all rights, powers, functions, and duties of the office of aerospace development and Pacific international space center for exploration systems to the division of aerospace development. Provides for the transfer of employees. Repeals the office of aerospace development and Pacific international space center for exploration systems within DBEDT. Establishes the Hawaii broadband office within the Hawaii technology development corporation. Appropriates funds.
