#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 30	2A- Automated external defibrillators; requirements;
5	training.	(a) By the end of the 2019-2020 school year:
6	(1)	All public schools shall have an automated external
7		defibrillator situated in a permanent location on
8		campus;
9	(2)	All public schools shall have an additional automated
10		external defibrillator permanently situated in each
11		campus facility where fitness activities take place,
12		including but not limited to a gymnasium, pool, or
13		weight room;
14	(3)	All public schools that have an athletic trainer shall
15		ensure that at every sporting event, an additional
16		automated external defibrillator is available and the
17		athletic trainer is trained through a hands-on skills



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1		session in the use of automated external
2		defibrillators at least once a year; and
3	(4)	All public schools that do not have an athletic
4		trainer shall ensure that at every sporting event, at
5		least two faculty members of the school are trained in
6		the use of automated external defibrillators at least
7		once every two years.
8	(b)	The department shall ensure that each automated
9	external	defibrillator is:
10	(1)	Maintained and regularly tested according to the
11		operation and maintenance guidelines set forth by the
12		manufacturer; and
13	(2)	Checked for readiness after each use and at least once
14		every thirty days if the automated external
15		defibrillator has not been used in the preceding
16		thirty days; provided that records of the checks shall
17		be maintained by the department and the individual
18		school.
19	<u>(c)</u>	For purposes of this section, "sporting event"
20	includes	competitions, scrimmages, and practices."

12		including but not limited to a gymnasium, pool, or

14	(3)	All private schools that have an athletic trainer
15		shall ensure that at every sporting event, an
16		additional automated external defibrillator is
17		available and the athletic trainer is trained through
18		a hands-on skills session in the use of automated
19		external defibrillators at least once a year; and

21		trainer shall ensure that at every sporting event, at

3		once every two years.

9	(3)	All charter schools that have an athletic trainer
10		shall ensure that at every sporting event, an
11		additional automated external defibrillator is
12		available and the athletic trainer is trained through
13		a hands-on skills session in the use of automated
14		external defibrillators at least once a year; and
15	(4)	All charter schools that do not have an athletic
16		trainer shall ensure that at every sporting event, at
17		least two faculty members of the school are trained
18		and certified at all times in the use of automated

15	training.	(a) By the end of the 2019-2020 school year:
16	(1)	All divisions and campuses of the University of Hawaii
17		system shall have an automated external defibrillator
18	•	situated in a permanent location on campus in
19		accordance with the requirements of this section. At
20		least one automated external defibrillator that is



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1		accessible to the public shall be placed on each floor
2		level of each place of public assembly; and
3	(2)	The athletic department of the University of Hawaii,
4		with regard to each institution under the University
5		of Hawaii system, shall ensure that:
6		(A) There is an automated external defibrillator
7		available to the athletic trainer present at
8		every sporting event; and
9		(B) Every athletic trainer is trained through a
10		hands-on skills session in the use of automated
11		external defibrillators at least once a year.
12	(b)	The University of Hawaii and each institution under
13	the Unive	rsity of Hawaii system shall ensure that each automated

3		external defibrillator that is accessible to the
4		public shall be placed on each floor level of each
5		place of public assembly; and
6	(2)	The athletic department of the private college or
7		university, with regard to each institution under the
8		private college or university's system, shall ensure
9		that:
10		(A) There is an automated external defibrillator
11		available to the athletic trainer present at
12		every sporting event; and
13		(B) Every athletic trainer is trained through a
14		hands-on skills session in the use of automated
15		external defibrillators at least once a year.

18	SECT	ION 6. Section 663-1.5; Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended b	y amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
20	"(e)	[Any person who in good faith, without remuneration
21	or expect	ation of remuneration, attempts to resuscitate a person



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1	in immediate danger of loss of life when administering any
2	automated external defibrillator, regardless of where the
3	automated external defibrillator that is used is located, shall
4	not be liable for any civil damages resulting from any act or
5	omission except as may result from the person's gross negligence
6	or wanton acts or omissions.
7	Any person, including an employer, who provides for an
8	automated external defibrillator or an automated external
9	defibrillator training program shall not be vicariously liable
10	for any civil damages resulting from any act or omission of the
11	persons or employees who, in good faith and without remuneration
12	or the expectation of remuneration, attempt to resuscitate a
13	person in immediate danger of loss of life by administering an
14	automated external defibrillator, except as may result from a
15	person's or employer's gross negligence or wanton acts or
16	omissions.] The following persons shall not be held liable for
17	any civil damages arising out of any acts or omissions relating
18	to the use, placement, or provision of an automated external
19	defibrillator except as may result from the person's gross
20	negligence or wanton acts or omissions:



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1	(1)	Any person who acquires an automated external
2		defibrillator;
3	(2)	Any person who owns, operates, manages, or is
4		otherwise responsible for the location where an
5		automated external defibrillator is placed;
6	(3)	Any person who retrieves or fails to retrieve an
7		automated external defibrillator;
8	(4)	Any person who uses, attempts to use, or fails to use
9		an automated external defibrillator;
10	(5)	Any person who was present at a location where an
11		automated external defibrillator was used or not used;
12	(6)	Any physician or other authorized healthcare provider
13		or person who issues a prescription for the purchase
14		of an automated external defibrillator or provides
15		medical oversight services to a location where an
16		automated external defibrillator is placed;
17	(7)	Any person who is involved with or responsible for the
18		design, management, or operation of an automated
19		external defibrillator program; and
20	(8)	Any person or entity that provides instruction in the
21		use of an automated external defibrillator.



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1	The immunity described in this subsection applies
2	regardless of where an automated external defibrillator is
3	retrieved or located."
4	SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
5	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
6	begun before its effective date.
7	SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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**Report Title:** Education; Automated External Defibrillators; Civil Liability

#### Description:

Requires by the end of the 2019-2020 school year, that all public schools, private schools, public charter schools, University of Hawaii and its divisions, campuses, and institutions, and private colleges and universities and their divisions, campuses, and institutions have automated external defibrillators situated in a permanent location on campus. Requires the public schools, private schools, public charter schools, University of Hawaii, and private colleges and universities that have an athletic trainer to have an automated external defibrillator available at each sporting event. Requires the automated external defibrillators to be maintained and tested regularly. Provides that any person who uses, places, or provides for an automated external defibrillator be immune from civil liability, except as may result from the person's gross negligence or wanton acts or omissions.
