### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEAD-BASED PAINT.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that lead has been shown
- 2 to cause neurological damage, behavioral and learning
- 3 disabilities in children, kidney damage, miscarriages, and more.
- 4 There is no safe level of exposure to lead and no way to reverse
- 5 the damage caused by lead exposure.
- 6 The legislature also finds that while restrictions on lead-
- 7 based paints have been in place for residential structures for
- 8 decades, only Delaware has restrictions on lead-based paints on
- 9 outdoor structures. Lead-based paints have historically been
- 10 used and continue to be allowed on outdoor structures such as
- 11 bridges, water towers, playground equipment, highways, parking
- 12 lots, and utility towers and poles. The use, maintenance, and
- 13 removal of paints containing lead on outdoor structures create
- 14 lead exposure pathways that are hazardous to workers,
- 15 contaminate the environment, and expose children and adults who
- 16 live, work, and play in proximity to these structures.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to reduce risks to public health
- 2 and welfare by banning the use of lead-based paints on outdoor
- 3 structures and to provide for an abatement plan for lead hazards
- 4 that already exist on outdoor structures.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 342P, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 7 and to read as follows:
- 8 "§342P- Prohibition of lead-based paint on outdoor
- 9 structures. (a) The use by any person of lead-based paint on
- 10 outdoor structures, whether applied to new outdoor structures or
- 11 already existing outdoor structures, shall be prohibited after
- 12 December 31, 2020.
- 13 (b) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 14 91 respecting the development of an outdoor structure lead-based
- 15 paint abatement plan which shall include but not be limited to
- 16 safe maintenance of outdoor structures with pre-existing lead-
- 17 based paint and safe removal of pre-existing lead-based paints
- 18 on outdoor structures."
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 20 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 21 begun before its effective date.

1 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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# S.B. NO. 259

### Report Title:

Lead-based Paint Prohibition; Outdoor Structures; Department of Health

#### Description:

Prohibits the use of lead-based paint on outdoor structures after 12/31/20. Directs the department of health to develop rules developing an outdoor structure lead-based paint abatement plan providing for the safe maintenance of outdoor structures that already have lead-based paint and the safe removal of pre-existing lead-based paint from outdoor structures.
