A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPORTS OFFICIALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 707-700, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately
3	inserted and to read as follows:
4	"Lawful discharge of a sports official's duty" means the
5	performance of duties of a sports official from the time the
6	sports official arrives at a sports events and ending when the
7	sports official returns to their residence or business.
8	"Sports event" means any organized amateur or professional
9	athletic contest in the State.
10	"Sports official" means a person at a sports event who
11	enforces the rules of the event, such as an umpire, referee,
12	timer, or scorer, or a person who supervises the participants,
13	such as a coach."
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 707, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by adding three new sections to part III to be
16	appropriately designated and to read as follows:



1	"§707- Assault against a sports official in the first
2	degree. (1) A person commits the offense of assault against a
3	sports official in the first degree if the person intentionally
4	or knowingly causes serious bodily injury to a sports official
5	engaged in the lawful discharge of the sports official's duties.
6	(2) Assault against a sports official in the first degree
7	is a class B felony.
8	<u>§707-</u> Assault against a sports official in the third
9	degree. (1) A person commits the offense of assault against a
10	sports official in the third degree if the person:
11	(a) Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly causes bodily
12	injury to a sports official engaged in the lawful
13	discharge of the sports official's duties; or
14	(b) Negligently causes bodily injury to a sports official
15	engaged in the lawful discharge of the sports
16	official's duties with a dangerous instrument.
17	(2) Assault in the third degree is a misdemeanor.
18	<u>§707-</u> Terroristic threatening against a sports official.
19	(1) A person commits the offense of terroristic threatening
20	against a sports official if the person threatens, by word or
21	conduct, to cause bodily injury to a sports official engaged in



1	the lawful	discharge of the sports official's duties or to
2	commit a f	elony with the intent to terrorize, or in reckless
3	disregard	of the risk of terrorizing, a sports official engaged
4	in the law	ful discharge of the sports official's duties.
5	(2)	Terroristic threatening against a sports official is a
6	class C fe	lony."
7	SECTI	ON 3. Section 707-711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by	amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
9	"(1)	A person commits the offense of assault in the second
10	degree if:	
11	(a)	The person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly
12		causes substantial bodily injury to another;
13	(b)	The person recklessly causes serious bodily injury to
14		another;
15	(c)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
16		injury to a correctional worker, as defined in section
17		710-1031(2), who is engaged in the performance of duty
18		or who is within a correctional facility;
19	(d)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
20		injury to another with a dangerous instrument;



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1 The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily (e) 2 injury to an educational worker who is engaged in the 3 performance of duty or who is within an educational facility. For the purposes of this paragraph, 4 "educational worker" means any administrator, 5 6 specialist, counselor, teacher, or employee of the 7 department of education or an employee of a charter school; a person who is a volunteer, as defined in 8 9 section 90-1, in a school program, activity, or 10 function that is established, sanctioned, or approved 11 by the department of education; or a person hired by 12 the department of education on a contractual basis and 13 engaged in carrying out an educational function; 14 (f) The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily 15 injury to any emergency medical services provider who 16 is engaged in the performance of duty. For the 17 purposes of this paragraph, "emergency medical 18 services provider" means emergency medical services 19 personnel, as defined in section 321-222, and 20 physicians, physician's assistants, nurses, nurse 21 practitioners, certified registered nurse



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1 anesthetists, respiratory therapists, laboratory 2 technicians, radiology technicians, and social 3 workers, providing services in the emergency room of a 4 hospital; 5 (g) The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily 6 injury to a person employed at a state-operated or 7 -contracted mental health facility. For the purposes 8 of this paragraph, "a person employed at a 9 state-operated or -contracted mental health facility" 10 includes health care professionals as defined in 11 section 451D-2, administrators, orderlies, security 12 personnel, volunteers, and any other person who is 13 engaged in the performance of a duty at a state-14 operated or -contracted mental health facility; 15 (h) The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily 16 injury to a person who: 17 (i) The defendant has been restrained from, by order 18 of any court, including an ex parte order, 19 contacting, threatening, or physically abusing 20 pursuant to chapter 586; or



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1 (ii) Is being protected by a police officer ordering 2 the defendant to leave the premises of that 3 protected person pursuant to section 709-906(4), 4 during the effective period of that order; 5 (i) The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily 6 injury to any firefighter or water safety officer who 7 is engaged in the performance of duty. For the 8 purposes of this paragraph, "firefighter" has the same 9 meaning as in section 710-1012 and "water safety 10 officer" means any public servant employed by the 11 United States, the State, or any county as a lifeguard 12 or person authorized to conduct water rescue or ocean 13 safety functions; 14 (j) The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily 15 injury to a person who is engaged in the performance 16 of duty at a health care facility as defined in 17 section 323D-2. For purposes of this paragraph, "a 18 person who is engaged in the performance of duty at a 19 health care facility" shall include health care 20 professionals as defined in section 451D-2, physician 21 assistants, surgical assistants, advanced practice



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1		registered nurses, nurse aides, respiratory
2		therapists, laboratory technicians, and radiology
3		technicians;
4	(k)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
5		injury to a person who is engaged in providing home
6		health care services, as defined in
7		section 431:10H-201; [or]
8	(1)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
9		injury to a person, employed or contracted to work by
10		a mutual benefit society, as defined in section
11		432:1-104, to provide case management services to an
12		individual in a hospital, health care provider's
13		office, or home, while that person is engaged in the
14		performance of those services [-]; or
15	<u>(m)</u>	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
16		injury to any sports official engaged in the lawful
17		discharge of their duties."
18	SECT	ION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
19	matured,]	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
20	begun befo	ore its effective date.
