A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COFFEE BERRY BORER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014 (Act 105), 2 established a pesticide subsidy program in the department of 3 agriculture for five years and having the purpose of assisting 4 coffee growers with offsetting the costs of purchasing certain 5 pesticides known to be effective against the coffee berry borer, 6 a highly destructive coffee pest that has infested coffee crops 7 on Hawaii island and more recently has been detected on Oahu and 8 Maui.

9 Act 152, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015 (Act 152), established 10 a pesticide subsidy program manager position as a full-time, 11 temporary position exempt from chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii 12 Revised Statutes, and appropriated moneys from the pesticide use 13 revolving fund for the position for fiscal years 2015-2016 and 14 2016-2017. Section 76-16(b)(17), Hawaii Revised Statutes, 15 provides that any exemption created after July 1, 2014, shall 16 expire three years after its enactment unless affirmatively 17 extended by an act of the legislature. Pursuant to section



76-16(b)(17), the exemption from civil service of the pesticide
subsidy program manager position expired on June 30, 2018, three
years after it was created by Act 152.

4 Because it took longer than anticipated for Act 105 to be 5 implemented, Act 65, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017 (Act 65), 6 extended the pesticide subsidy program from its original sunset 7 date of June 30, 2019, to a new sunset date of June 30, 2021, to assist coffee growers for the number of years intended when Act 8 9 105 was enacted. However, Act 65 did not extend the civil 10 service and collective bargaining laws exemption of the 11 pesticide subsidy program manager position.

12 Pursuant to section 3(c) of Act 105, an application for a 13 subsidy for pesticide purchases made in a fiscal year must be 14 filed in the immediately following fiscal year. For pesticide 15 purchases made in the last fiscal year of the program, from July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, applications for subsidies must 16 17 be filed in the immediately following fiscal year, anytime from 18 July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022. The manager position will be 19 needed to process these applications for subsidies for costs 20 incurred in the final year of the program. Accordingly, Act 32, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, extended the pesticide subsidy 21



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1 program manager position, including the position's civil service 2 and collective bargaining laws exemption, until June 30, 2022. 3 The purposes of this Act are to extend the pesticide 4 subsidy program by three years, to June 30, 2025; extend the 5 pesticide subsidy program manager position, including the 6 position's civil service and collective bargaining laws 7 exemption, until the year after the program sunsets, 8 specifically, June 30, 2026; and make appropriations for the 9 program and program manager position for fiscal year 2020-2021. 10 SECTION 2. Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, as 11 amended by section 1 of Act 152, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, as 12 amended by section 2 of Act 65, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, as 13 amended by section 2 of Act 32, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, as 14 amended by section 43 of Act 111, Sessions Laws of Hawaii 2019, 15 is amended as follows: 16 1. By amending section 3 to read: 17 "SECTION 3. (a) There is established in the department of

18 agriculture a pesticide subsidy program to be administered by 19 the department beginning on July 1, 2014, and ending on June 30, 20 [2021.] 2025. The department shall grant subsidies to coffee 21 growers to assist them in offsetting the costs of purchasing any

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1 pesticide that is listed by the department pursuant to 2 subsection (f). 3 Applications for subsidies by coffee growers shall be (b) 4 submitted on a form furnished by the department and shall be 5 filed with accompanying documentation of the costs of purchasing the pesticide; provided that: 6 7 (1)The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the State and its officers, agents, and employees from all 8 9 claims arising out of or resulting from the pesticide 10 purchased; and 11 (2) The department may request an applicant to provide 12 necessary information for the purposes of verifying 13 the size or sale weight, as applicable, and amount of 14 the pesticide purchased. 15 (c) Documentation of pesticide costs, as requested by the 16 department, shall be filed for pesticides purchased within the 17 immediate preceding fiscal year of filing and shall be effective 18 for pesticide costs incurred after June 30, 2014, and before 19 July 1, [2021.] 2025.

20 (d) Funds shall be disbursed upon approval on an annual21 basis by the department to the coffee grower for up to seventy-

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five per cent of the costs incurred for the purchase of the
pesticide before July 1, 2016, and for up to fifty per cent of
the costs incurred after June 30, 2016, and before July 1,
[2021.] 2025.

5 The department shall aggregate the total subsidy (e) 6 applications pursuant to this section and divide and distribute 7 the available subsidy funds on a pro rata basis; provided that 8 no single coffee grower shall receive subsidies that are more 9 than \$600 per year per acre of land in coffee production; 10 provided further that no single coffee grower shall receive 11 subsidies that are more than \$9,000 per year; provided further 12 that no single coffee grower shall receive subsidies that total 13 more than \$6,000 per year for the period after June 30, 2018, and before July 1, [2021.] 2025. 14

(f) The department shall establish a list of pesticides that are registered with the Environmental Protection Agency and are licensed with the State that contain *Beauveria bassiana*, a fungus known to eradicate the coffee berry borer, as an active ingredient.

20 (g) There is established within the department a pesticide21 subsidy program manager position, which shall be a full-time,

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1 temporary position exempt from chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii 2 Revised Statutes. The pesticide subsidy program manager shall 3 possess a requisite level of knowledge and expertise in the area 4 of program management necessary to carry out the duties of the 5 position. The pesticide subsidy program manager shall: 6 (1) Facilitate the efficient division and distribution of 7 available subsidy funds; and 8 (2) Manage the day-to-day coordination for the pesticide 9 subsidy program. 10 The pesticide subsidy program manager shall receive a 11 salary of not more than \$50,000 per year. The pesticide subsidy 12 program manager position, including the position's exemption 13 from chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall expire on June 30, [2022.] 2026. 14 15 (h) Not later than twenty days prior to the convening of 16 the regular session of $[\frac{2021}{7}]$ 2025, the department shall submit 17 a report of its findings and recommendations, including any 18 proposed legislation, to the legislature on the results of the 19 subsidy program and whether the program should be allowed to 20 expire or be extended, and if extended, with or without

21 modification.

16	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general fund
17	the sum of \$175,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for
18	fiscal year 2020-2021 for the pesticide subsidy program
19	established by Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, including
20	the sum of \$25,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for
21	fiscal year 2020-2021 for the salary and fringe benefits of the

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pesticide subsidy program manager position established by Act
152, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015.
The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
