A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UTILITY TRANSMISSION LINES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 269-27.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§269-27.6 Construction of high-voltage electric
- 4 transmission lines; overhead or underground construction. (a)
- 5 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, and as provided in
- 6 subsection (b), whenever a public utility applies to the public
- 7 utilities commission for approval to place, construct, erect, or
- 8 otherwise build a new 46 kilovolt or greater high-voltage
- 9 electric transmission system, either above or below the surface
- 10 of the ground, the public utilities commission shall determine
- 11 whether the electric transmission system shall be placed,
- 12 constructed, erected, or built above or below the surface of the
- 13 ground; provided that in its determination, the public utilities
- 14 commission shall consider:
- 15 (1) Whether a benefit exists that outweighs the costs of
- placing the electric transmission system underground;

1	(2)	whether there is a governmental public policy
2		requiring the electric transmission system to be
3		placed, constructed, erected, or built underground,
4		and the governmental agency establishing the policy
5		commits funds for the additional costs of
6		undergrounding;
7	(3)	Whether any governmental agency or other parties are
8		willing to pay for the additional costs of
9		undergrounding;
10	(4)	The recommendation of the division of consumer
11		advocacy of the department of commerce and consumer
12		affairs, which shall be based on an evaluation of the
13		factors set forth under this subsection; and
14	(5)	Any other relevant factors.
15	(b)	Notwithstanding the requirements in subsection (a), a
16	public ut	ility shall not be required to seek approval from the
17	public ut	ilities commission to place, construct, erect, or
18	otherwise	build a high-voltage electric transmission system, if
19	the elect	ric transmission system is to be built underground and
20	meets the	following requirements:

1	(1)	The entire additional cost due to building
2		underground, rather than above ground, is paid by an
3		entity other than the public utility; and
4	(2)	Prior to commencing construction, the public utility
5		provides a report to the public utilities commission,
6		with a copy to the consumer advocate, describing in
7		detail the electric transmission system and verifying
8		that additional costs of building underground will be
9		paid by an entity other than the public utility.
10	[-(d) -]	(c) In making the determination set forth in
11	subsection	n (a), for new 138 kilovolt or greater high-voltage
12	transmiss	ion systems, the public utilities commission shall
13	evaluate a	and make specific findings on all of the following
14	factors:	
15	(1)	The amortized cost of construction over the respective
16		usable life of an above-ground versus underground
17		system;
18	(2)	The amortized cost of repair over the respective
19		usable life of an above-ground versus underground
20		system;

1	(3)	The risk of damage or destruction over the respective
2		usable life of an above-ground versus an underground
3		system;
4	(4)	The relative safety and liability risks of an above-
5		ground versus underground system;
6	(5)	The electromagnetic field emission exposure from an
7		above-ground versus underground system;
8	(6)	The proximity and visibility of an above-ground system
9		to:
10		(A) High density population areas;
11		(B) Conservation and other valuable natural resource
12		and public recreation areas;
13		(C) Areas of special importance to the tourism
14		industry; and
15		(D) Other industries particularly dependent on
16		Hawaii's natural beauty;
17	(7)	The length of the system;
18	(8)	The breadth and depth of public sentiment with respect
19		to an above-ground versus underground system; and
20	(9)	Any other factors that the public utilities commission
21		deems relevant.

- 1 [(c)] (d) A public utility making an application to the
- 2 public utilities commission under this section shall clearly and
- 3 fully state and support its evaluation of each factor set forth
- 4 in subsection [(b).] (c)."
- 5 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
