### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many affordable 2 housing projects are delayed because of the state historic 3 preservation division's inability to efficiently and effectively 4 provide necessary reviews to ensure compliance with state 5 historic preservation law. The purpose of this Act is to 6 authorize the counties to employ qualified archaeologists to 7 perform necessary reviews under chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised 8 Statutes. 9 SECTION 2. Section 6E-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

10 amended to read as follows:

"S6E-42 Review of proposed projects[-]; approval;
expedited hearing. (a) Except as provided in section 6E-42.2,
before any agency or officer of the State or its political
subdivisions approves any project involving a permit, license,
certificate, land use change, subdivision, or other entitlement
for use, which may affect historic property, aviation artifacts,
or a burial site, the agency or office shall [advise] give



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1	notice to the department [and prior to any approval] of the		
2	project to allow the department or a qualified archaeologist		
3	employed by the county in which the project is located an		
4	opportunity for review and comment on the effect of the proposed		
5	project on historic properties, aviation artifacts, or burial		
6	sites, consistent with section 6E-43, including those listed in		
7	the Hawaii register of historic places. If:		
8	(1) The proposed project consists of corridors or large		
9.	land areas;		
10	(2) Access to properties is restricted; or		
11	(3) Circumstances dictate that construction be done in		
12	stages,		
13	the [ <del>department's</del> ] <u>department or archaeologist's</u> review and		
14	comment may be based on a phased review of the project; provided		
15	that there shall be a programmatic agreement between the		
16	department and the project applicant that identifies each phase		
17	and the estimated timelines for each phase.		
18	(b) The department shall inform the public of any project		
19	proposals submitted to it under this section that are not		
20	otherwise subject to the requirement of a public hearing or		
21	other public notification.		



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1	(c)	The archaeological review and comment required by this
2	section ma	y be delegated to a qualified archaeologist employed
3	by the cou	inty in which the project is located with the approval
4	of the dep	partment.
5	(d)	As used in this section, "qualified archaeologist"
6	means the	principal investigator for the project with the
7	following	qualifications:
8	(1)	A graduate degree from an accredited institution in
9		archaeology or anthropology with a specialization in
10		archaeology;
11	(2)	At least one year of cumulative archaeological
12		experience in Hawaii or the Pacific region;
13	<u>(3)</u>	At least four months of supervised archaeological
14		finds and analytical experience in Hawaii; and
15	(4)	A demonstrated knowledge of historic preservation
16		laws, rules, and guidelines.
17	(e)	The department shall approve, approve with
18	modificati	on, or disapprove an archaeological review within
19	thirty day	s of submission of a completed review. If, on the
20	thirty-fir	st day, a review is not approved, approved with



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1	modification, or disapproved by the department, the review shall
2	be deemed approved.
3	(f) A person aggrieved by the findings and recommendation
4	of an archaeological review may bring an action against the
5	department. The circuit court in which the complaint is made
6	shall have jurisdiction over the action brought under this
7	section. Except as to cases the court considers of greater
8	importance, proceedings brought under this section shall take
9	precedence and shall be expedited in every way.
10	[ <del>(c)</del> ] <u>(g)</u> The department shall adopt rules in accordance
11	with chapter 91 to implement this section."
12	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
