A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 421, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding three new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§421- Volunteers exempted. Section 421C-33 shall apply
5	to associations formed under this chapter.
6	§421- Operation as an agent on nonprofit basis. (a) A
7	cooperative may operate as an agent to sell the products of its
8	members or nonmember patrons on a nonprofit basis by contracting
9	to pay the members or nonmember patrons the resale price for
10	products sold by them to or through the cooperative, less a
11	uniform charge to cover the expenses involved in the handling of
12	these products; provided that:
13	(1) The resale price shall be the actual resale price or a
14	price based upon the average price during any period
15	for products of the same type and quantity; and
16	(2) The uniform charge for expenses shall be:
17	(A) Specified in the contract;

1	(B) Made otherwise ascertainable; or		
2	(C) Left for determination by the directors.		
3	(b) A cooperative that desires to purchase goods or obtain		
4	or perform services under this chapter may operate on a		
5	nonprofit basis in a manner similar to that described in this		
6	section.		
7	§421- General cooperative status. An association formed		
8	under this chapter may convert to a cooperative association or		
9	remain an agricultural cooperative."		
10	SECTION 2. Chapter 421C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
11	amended by adding three new sections to be appropriately

13	"§421C- Referendum. Section 421-17 shall apply to		
14	associations formed under this chapter.		
15	§421C- Operation as an agent on nonprofit basis. (a) A		
16	cooperative may operate as an agent to sell the products of its

18	to pay the members or nonmember patrons the resale price for

15	SECT	ION 3. Section 421-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended t	o read as follows:
17	"§42	1-2 Purposes. An association may be organized for the
18	purpose o	f engaging in any cooperative activity for producers of
19	agricultu	ral products in connection with:
20	(1)	Producing, assembling, marketing, buying or selling
21		agricultural products or harvesting, preserving,

		drying, processing, manuraccuring, brending, caming,
2		packing, ginning, grading, storing, warehousing,
3		handling, shipping, or utilizing the products, or
4		manufacturing or marketing the byproducts, thereof;
5		provided seventy-five per cent of such agricultural
6		products shall be of Hawaiian origin;
7	(2)	Manufacturing, buying for or supplying to its members
8		machinery, equipment, feed, fertilizer, fuel, seeds,
9		and other agricultural supplies;
10	(3)	Performing or furnishing business or educational
11		services, on a cooperative basis, or to its members;
12	(4)	Leasing land to its members; and
13	[(4)]	(5) Financing any of the above enumerated activities
14		for its members."
15	SECT	ION 4. Section 421-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended to	o read as follows:
17	"§42	1-17 Referendum. The articles or bylaws may provide
18	that upon	demand of two-fifths of all the directors, or by the
19	affirmati	ve vote of two-thirds of the members voting thereon at
20	any regul	ar meeting or at a special meeting called for that
21	purpose,	any matter of policy that has been approved or passed

- 1 by the board must be referred to the members for their approval
- 2 before it becomes effective. [No referendum shall be allowed
- 3 unless it is demanded by the required number of directors at the
- 4 meeting at which the matter of policy in question is adopted.] "
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 6 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 7 begun before its effective date.
- 8 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
