A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A FOOD HUB PILOT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that our state's food 2 security may be strengthened by growing more food locally and 3 increasing residents' access to local food. This endeavor may 4 be supported by establishing food hubs, which are centrally 5 located facilities with a business management structure that 6 facilitates the aggregation, storage, processing, distribution, 7 or marketing of local produced food products. By actively 8 coordinating these activities along the value chain, food hubs 9 may provide wider access to institutional and retail markets for 10 small to mid-sized producers, and increase consumers' access to 11 fresh healthy food, including those consumers in underserved areas and "food deserts." 12

13 The legislature also finds that food hubs encounter 14 financial obstacles when seeking to launch or expand their 15 operations. Non-profit organizations may apply for certain 16 types of federal program funding, but the awarded amounts are 17 generally insufficient for anything but small-scale farming.



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Therefore, a funding source is needed to support the
 establishment and growth of food hubs on a scale that meets
 demand by state institutions such as schools, hospitals, and
 correctional facilities.

5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
6 five-year food hub pilot program under the department of
7 agriculture and appropriate funds for the program.

8 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a five-year food hub 9 pilot program, which shall be administered by the department of 10 agriculture.

11 (b) The pilot program shall:

12 (1) Adopt the United States Department of Agriculture's 13 working definition of "food hub," which is "a 14 centrally located facility with a business management 15 structure facilitating the aggregation, storage, 16 processing, distribution, and/or marketing of 17 locally/regionally produced food products; " and 18 (2) Award grant funding to qualified applicants for the 19 construction of critical infrastructure to establish 20 and expand food hubs in each of the counties of Maui, 21 Kauai, Hawaii, and Honolulu, including:



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1		(A)	Construction of facilities that comply with food
2			safety requirements, including aggregation,
3			washing, minimal processing, packaging, cold
4			storage, and other value-added facilities; and
5		(B)	Provision of technical assistance to develop in-
6			state capacity to supply state institutions and
7			other markets.
8	(c)	The	department of agriculture shall establish criteria
9	for the av	ward	of initial start-up grant funding and subsequent
10	expansion	fund	ing under the pilot program, including the
11	following	prov	isions:
12	(1)	Prio	rity shall be given to funding the establishment
13		of f	ood hubs in areas where none currently exist;
14	(2)	Qual	ifying applicants shall include limited liability
15		corp	orations, for-profit organizations, non-profit
16		orga	nizations, and agricultural cooperatives;
17	(3)	Appl	icants seeking initial start-up funding shall have
18		firs	t secured a physical location for the food hub and
19		draf	ted a detailed plan for the food hub's operation,
20		incl	uding activities that the applicant intends to
21		enga	ge in, such as serving as a marketplace for buying



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1	and selling, or providing certified kitchen space in			
2	which multiple farmers may share use of facilities for			
3	value-added product development; and			
4	(4) Applicants shall explain their intended actions to			
5	increase access to locally produced food.			
6	(d) The department of agriculture shall adopt rules			
7	pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for the			
8	administration and operation of the pilot program.			
9	SECTION 3. (a) The department of agriculture shall submit			
10	interim reports on:			
11	(1) The department's progress in implementing this Act;			
12	(2) Preliminary results of the food hub pilot program; and			
13	(3) The department's findings and recommendations,			
14	including any proposed legislation,			
15	to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the			
16	convening of the regular sessions of 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024.			
17	(b) The department shall submit a final report of its			
18	findings and recommendations, including any proposed			
19	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior			
20	to the convening of the regular session of 2025. The report			
21	shall include the results of the food hub pilot program and a			



recommendation as to whether the program should be expanded
 statewide, with or without modifications.

3 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the 6 establishment of a five-year food hub pilot program, including 7 the awarding of grant moneys to qualifying food hubs.

8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of9 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
