A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY STEERING COMMITTEE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds it to be in the best 2 interest of the public to allow the members of the information 3 technology steering committee to serve without regard to term 4 limits because their institutional knowledge of the State's 5 complex information systems would assist the chief information 6 officer in developing the State's information technology 7 standards and policies. In addition, the legislature finds it 8 to be in the best interest of the public for the superintendent 9 of education and president of the University of Hawaii to 10 appoint representatives to the committee.

SECTION 2. Section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: "(b) There is established an information technology steering committee to assist the chief information officer in developing the State's information technology standards and policies, including but not limited to:
