PURPOSE: The purpose of this bill is to revise the

JUSTIFICATION: Maintenance schedules to extend the useful life of a facility or equipment is the

primary function of preventive maintenance.

A procuring agency's practical response to budgetary limitations may result in deferred maintenance or, when appropriate, through an

emergency procurement.

Impact on the public: This bill broadens allowable emergency procurements within the intent of the procurement code's competition requirements. It shifts the showing of transparency from requiring approval from the chief procurement officer to a reporting by the head of the purchasing agency to the

legislature.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This bill will allow the head of the

purchasing agency to decide when it is
