A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HOUSING LOAN AND MORTGAGE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the affordable
 housing crisis continues to be one of the State's most
 significant and challenging problems. As the cost of housing
 increases, the State must continue to assist residents in
 obtaining affordable rental housing.

6 The purpose of this Act is to provide that assistance by
7 increasing the Hula Mae multifamily revenue bond authorization
8 from \$1,500,000,000 to \$2,500,000,000.

9 SECTION 2. Act 291, Session Laws of Hawaii 1980, as

16 "SECTION 11. Issuance of revenue bond; amount authorized.
17 Revenue bonds may be issued by the Hawaii housing finance and



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1 development corporation pursuant to part $III[_{T}]$ of chapter 39 and subpart A of part III of chapter 201H, Hawaii Revised 2 3 Statutes, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed [\$1,500,000,000] \$2,500,000,000 at such times and in such 4 5 amounts as the Hawaii housing finance and development 6 corporation deems advisable for the purpose of undertaking and 7 maintaining any of the housing loan programs under subpart A of 8 part III of chapter 201H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to 9 the funding or purchasing of eligible project loans." 10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
