PURPOSE:

To allow mixed martial arts promoters to pay

fighters with cash.

MEANS:

Amend section 440E-7(a), Hawaii Revised

Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

Currently, section 440E-7(a)(4), HRS, requires that promoters pay fighters with either cashier's or certified checks. However, almost every event involves lastminute changes to the fight card due to a

minute changes to the fight card due to a fighter not making weight or getting injured during training. The fighter's weigh-in takes place the day before the event, and most of the events are held on a Saturday. As a result, it is very difficult for the promoter to get new checks issued on a

Saturday because most financial institutions are closed. If cash is allowed as another form of payment, it will be easier to make changes to the fighter's compensation. As expected, the fighters prefer cash payment.
