#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELORS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 453D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$453D-7 Application for licensure as a mental health

4 counselor. (a) An applicant shall be issued a license by the

5 department if the applicant provides satisfactory evidence to

6 the department that the applicant is qualified for licensure

7 pursuant to the requirements of this chapter and meets the

8 following qualifications:

(1) [A] Receipt of a master's degree or doctoral degree 9 10 from an accredited educational institution in 11 counseling or in an allied field related to the practice of mental health counseling that includes, or 12 is supplemented by, graduate level course work in 13 14 counseling comprising a minimum of forty-eight 15 semester hours or seventy-two quarter hours in the 16 following course areas, with a minimum of three 17 semester hours or five quarter hours in each course

area as indicated below:

5		licensed mental health counselor, psychologist,
6		clinical social worker, advanced practice registered
7		nurse with a specialty in mental health, marriage and
8		family therapist, or physician with a specialty in
9		psychiatry[;]. In collaboration with the supervisor,
10		the applicant may elect to fulfill some or all of the
11		supervision requirements through face-to-face
12		supervision that is conducted electronically through a
13		videoconference service that complies with all federal
14		and state privacy, security, and confidentiality laws,
15		including the Health Insurance Portability and
16		Accountability Act of 1996. Prior to making this
17		election, it is incumbent upon the applicant to review
18		the laws and rules of other jurisdictions to determine
19		the impact, if any, that electronic supervision may
20		have on licensure by endorsement or reciprocity in
21		other states; and

#### Report Title:

Mental Health Counselor; License Requirement; Practicum Internship Experience; Post-graduate Experience Supervision; Chapter 453D

#### Description:

Clarifies that the practicum internship experience requirement shall be included with the course work in counseling requirement for mental health counselors. Clarifies the supervision requirements of licensure for mental health counselors by permitting applicants to fulfill all or part of their face-to-face clinical supervision requirement by a videoconference service.

TITLE:

PURPOSE:

To clarify that the practicum internship experience requirement shall be included with the course work in counseling requirement for mental health counselors. To clarify the supervision requirements of licensure for mental health counselors by permitting applicants to fulfill all or part of their face-to-face clinical supervision

requirement by a videoconference service.

MEANS:

Amend section 453D-7, Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Hawaii Mental Health Counselors
Licensing Program (Program) is the only
jurisdiction that includes the practicum
internship requirement as a separate,
standalone requirement rather than include
it with the course work in counseling
requirement. As such, all applicants for a
Hawaii mental health counselor license must
provide 54 semester hours or 82 quarter
hours of course work training, versus the
national standard of 48 semester hours or 72
quarter hours in course work in counseling.

Impact on the public: This bill would positively impact prospective applicants who are applying for a mental health counselor license in Hawaii by standardizing the Program's license requirements to the national license standards of 48 semester hours or 72 quarter hours of course work in counseling.
