A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 453D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§453D-7 Application for licensure as a mental health
4 counselor. (a) An applicant shall be issued a license by the
5 department if the applicant provides satisfactory evidence to
6 the department that the applicant is qualified for licensure
7 pursuant to the requirements of this chapter and meets the
8 following qualifications:

[A] Receipt of a master's degree or doctoral degree 9 (1)from an accredited educational institution in 10 counseling or in an allied field related to the 11 practice of mental health counseling that includes, or 12 13 is supplemented by, graduate level course work in counseling comprising a minimum of forty-eight 14 semester hours or seventy-two quarter hours in the 15 following course areas, with a minimum of three 16

2	area	as indicated below:
3	(A)	Human growth and development, including, but not
4		limited to, the study of life span development,
5		strategies to facilitate that development and
6		transitions, theories of learning and personality
7		development, and human behavior to include

9		environmental factors;
10	(B)	Social and cultural foundations, including, but
11		not limited to, the study of issues and trends in
12		a multicultural and diverse society, including
13		characteristics of diverse groups that may
14		include, but are not limited to, age, race,
15		religious or sexual preference, physical
16		disability, ethnicity and culture, gender,
17		socioeconomics, intellectual ability, and
18		individual, family, and group strategies with
19		diverse populations;
20	(C)	Counseling theories and applications, including,
21		but not limited to, counseling and consultation,



1		including both individual and systems
2		perspectives, interviewing, assessment, and
3		counseling skills, as well as applying
4		principles, methods, and theories of counseling,
5		treatment and counseling of mental and emotional
6		disorders, and educational techniques aimed at
7		preventing [such] <u>these</u> disorders with
8		individuals and families;
9	(D)	Group theory and practice, including, but not
10		limited to <u>,</u> principles of group dynamics, group
11		process, group leadership styles, theories and
12		methods of group counseling, and the application
13		of theory to the group processes;
14	(E)	Career and lifestyle development, including, but
15		not limited to, the study of vocational
16		development theories and decision-making models,
17		assessment instruments, and techniques, types,
18		sources, and uses of occupational and educational
19		information systems, career development
20		applications, and career counseling processes,
21		techniques, and resources;



1	(F)	Appraisal of human behavior, including, but not
2		limited to, assessment and diagnosis of disorders
3		with an emphasis on [$\frac{DSM-IV}{DSM}$ categories[$_{ au}$]
4		and an understanding of these disorders relative
5		to the counseling context;
6	(G)	Tests and measurements, including, but not
7		limited to, theoretical and historical bases for
8		assessment techniques, <u>as well as</u> assessment
9		methods, including analysis of various types of
10		tests to select, administer, interpret, and use
11		assessment and evaluation instruments and
12		techniques in counseling;
13	(H)	Research and program evaluation, including, but
14		not limited to, research design and methods,
15		statistical analysis, principles, practices, and
16		application of needs assessment, and program
17		evaluation; [and]
18	(I)	Professional orientation and ethics, including,
19		but not limited to, the history of the helping
20		profession, professional roles and functions,
21		ethical standards, confidentiality, professional



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1			organizations, and the public policy process,
2			including advocacy on behalf of the profession
3			and its clientele; and
4		(J)	At least two academic terms of supervised mental
5			health practicum intern experience for graduate
6			credit of at least six semester hours or ten
7			quarter hours in a mental health counseling
8			setting, with a total of three hundred hours of
9			supervised client contact. The practicum
10			experience shall be completed under the clinical
11			supervision of a person who is licensed as a
12			mental health counselor, psychologist, clinical
13			social worker, advanced practice registered nurse
14			with a specialty in mental health, marriage and
15			family therapist, or physician with a specialty
16			in psychiatry;
17	[(2)	At	least two-academic terms of supervised mental
18		heal	th practicum intern experience for graduate credit
19		of a	t least six semester hours or ten-quarter hours a
20		ment	al health counseling setting with three hundred
21		hour	s of supervised client contact; the practicum



1		experience shall be completed under the clinical
2		supervision of a person who is licensed as a mental
3		health counselor, psychologist, clinical social
4		worker, advanced practice registered nurse with a
5		specialty in mental health, marriage and family
6		therapist, or physician with a specialty in
7		psychiatry;
8	(3)]	(2) Completion of not less than three thousand hours
9		of post-graduate experience in the practice of mental
10		health counseling, with one hundred hours of face-to-
11		face clinical supervision that shall be completed in
12		no less than two years and in no more than four years,
13		under the clinical supervision of a person who is a
14		licensed mental health counselor, psychologist,
15		clinical social worker, advanced practice registered
16		nurse with a specialty in mental health, marriage and
17		family therapist, or physician with a specialty in
18		psychiatry $[+]$. In collaboration with the supervisor,
19		the applicant may elect to fulfill some or all of the
20		supervision requirements through face-to-face
21		supervision that is conducted electronically through a



1		videoconference service that complies with all federal
2		and state privacy, security, and confidentiality laws,
3		including the Health Insurance Portability and
4		Accountability Act of 1996. Prior to making this
5		election, it is incumbent upon the applicant to review
6		the laws and rules of other jurisdictions to determine
7		the impact, if any, that electronic supervision may
8		have on licensure by endorsement or reciprocity in
9		other states; and
10	[-(4)-	Passed] (3) Passage of the National Counselor
11		Examination for Licensure and Certification.
12	(b)	An individual [$who:$] shall be deemed to have met the
13	requireme	nts of this section if the individual:
14	(1)	Holds current, unencumbered certification as a
15		national certified counselor or a national certified
16		rehabilitation counselor prior to the effective date
17		of this chapter;
18	(2)	Has passed the National Counselor Examination for
19		Licensure and Certification, National Clinical Mental
20		Health Counselors Examination of the National Board
21		for Certified Counselors, or Commission on



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1		Rehabilitation Counselor Certification examination
2		after January 1, 2000, and before July 1, 2005; and
3	(3)	Within one year of the effective date of this chapter,
4		applies for licensure and pays the applicable license
5		fee[, shall be deemed to have met the requirements of
6		this section].
7	(c)	For an applicant who graduated from an accredited
8	education	al institution as specified in subsection (a)(1) before
9	July 1, 2	007, the department shall also deem acceptable:
10	(1)	For practicum intern experience, written certification
11		from an official of the institution of higher
12		education attesting that the applicant has completed
13		the academic terms, graduate credit hours, and
14		supervised client contact hours in subsection $[(a)(2)]$
15		(a) (1) (J) and that the applicant's practicum intern
16		experience is equivalent to a mental health graduate
17		level practicum program; and
18	(2)	For post-graduate experience, written certification
19		from an officer and the clinical supervisor of the
20		agency at which the applicant has earned experience
21		attesting that the applicant has completed the hours



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of experience and supervision in subsection [-(a)(3)]1 (a)(2), within the time frame set forth in that 2 subsection, and that the applicant's post-graduate 3 experience is equivalent to the practice of mental 4 health counseling. 5 The license requirements for clinical supervisors under 6 subsections $\left[\frac{a}{2}\right]$ (a) (1) (J) and $\left[\frac{a}{3}\right]$ (a) (2) shall not 7 8 apply to this subsection." SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 11

Mental Health Counselor; License Requirement; Practicum Internship Experience; Post-graduate Experience Supervision; Chapter 453D

Description:

Clarifies that the practicum internship experience requirement shall be included with the course work in counseling requirement for mental health counselors. Clarifies the supervision requirements of licensure for mental health counselors by permitting applicants to fulfill all or part of their face-toface clinical supervision requirement by a videoconference service.
