Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the fees or other nontax 4 5 revenues assessed or charged by any board, commission, or other 6 governmental agency may be increased or decreased by the body in 7 an amount not to exceed fifty per cent of the statutorily 8 assessed fee or nontax revenue, to maintain a reasonable 9 relation between the revenues derived from such fee or nontax 10 revenue and the cost or value of services rendered, 11 comparability among fees imposed by the State, or any other 12 purpose which it may deem necessary and reasonable; provided 13 that: 14 The authority to increase or decrease fees or nontax 15 revenues shall be subject to the approval of the 16 governor and extend only to the following: chapters 17 36, 92, 94, 142, 144, 145, 147, 150, 171, 188, 189,

its fees.
