BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 462A-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 3 "\$462A-6 Duration and renewal of license. All licenses
- 4 shall expire on June 30 of even-numbered years. All applicants

- 12 SECTION 2. Section 462A-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 14 "\$462A-11 Rates of pilotage. The director shall establish
- 15 the rates of pilotage for vessels subject to this chapter as

1	(1)	The rates of pilotage in effect on July 1, 1978, shall
2		remain in effect until changed by the director
3		pursuant to this chapter.

- (2) No rate shall be increased, lowered, or altered without a public hearing in accordance with chapter 91. Due notice of hearing shall be mailed at least thirty days prior to the date of hearing to the individual licensed pilots, the pilot's association, and all owners, charterers, operators, and agents of vessels who have registered with the department.
- (3) The director, in setting rates of pilotage, shall fix such amounts as will be a fair charge for the services rendered with due regard to necessary operating expenses, maintenance of, depreciation on, and return on investment for property used in the business of pilotage[, and the rates and charges of pilotage at comparable ports of the United States].
- (4) Persons aggrieved by the director's decision setting the rates of pilotage may appeal to circuit court as provided in chapter 91."
- 21 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 22 and stricken.

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PORT PILOTS.

PURPOSE:

To align the license renewal requirements with those of other professions and vocations. To remove the use of rates from comparable ports for rate increase petitions.

MEANS:

Amend sections 462A-6 and 462A-11, Hawaii

Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

Currently, section 462A-6, HRS, allows all port pilot licensees to renew their licenses if they remain in active service as a pilot in the State. No other profession or vocation that the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' Professional and Vocational Licensing Division (PVL) licenses has similar active service language. The repeal of this language will make the license renewal of this profession consistent with that of other professions and vocations under the jurisdiction of the PVI.

Currently, section 462A-11, HRS, requires the Port Pilot Program to look at comparable ports when setting new pilotage rates. Hawaii ports are unique in their geographic location and topography, and their rates cannot be compared to the rates of other ports, such as Alaska's or Mississippi's.
