A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that disaster recovery is
- 2 a complex and long-term process that involves a range of
- 3 activities, including short-term restoration of essential
- 4 community functions and long-term resilient rebuilding, and many
- 5 participants. Recovery begins shortly after the disaster occurs
- 6 and can continue for many years. Recovery also incorporates
- 7 hazard mitigation as restoration and rebuilding take place.
- 8 State, public, and private organizations share in providing
- 9 for the public's health and safety. It is essential that the
- 10 response, recovery, and mitigation activities of all parties be
- 11 fully aligned.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to enhance the capacity of the
- 13 government, relevant agencies, and the community to recover from
- 14 the impacts of disasters and build resilience and sustainability
- 15 by establishing the long-term recovery authority to work with
- 16 the state disaster recovery coordinator, whose position was
- 17 funded through Act 113, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019.



1	SECTION 2. Chapter 127A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended b	y adding two new sections to be appropriately
3	designate	d and to read as follows:
4	"§127A- Long-term recovery authority; general	
5	functions	, duties, and powers. (a) There is established the
6	long-term	recovery authority under the Hawaii emergency
7	management agency to:	
8	(1)	Recommend policy decisions and set strategic direction
9		for resilient recovery planning;
10	(2)	Recommend legislation that furthers recovery goals;
11	(3)	Approve administrative decisions of the state disaster
12		recovery coordinator; and
13	(4)	Facilitate the identification, coordination, and
14		delivery of recovery assistance efforts to supplement
15		resources and efforts by local governments and
16		citizens.
17	<u>(b)</u>	The long-term recovery authority shall be flexible in
18	size and	composition to meet the requirements of the applicable
19	situation	and integrate personnel from all relevant entities.
20	(c)	The long-term recovery authority shall be convened by
21	the state	disaster recovery coordinator.

1	<u>(d)</u>	Notwithstanding subsection (b), the long-term recovery
2	authority	shall include the following members:
3	(1)	The adjutant general or the adjutant general's
4		designee;
5	(2)	The administrator of the Hawaii emergency management
6		agency or the administrator's designee;
7	(3)	The director of finance or the director's designee;
8	(4)	The county mayors or their designees;
9	(5)	The directors of state departments or agencies that
10		have been designated as the primary department or
11		agency responsible for recovery support functions or
12		the directors' designees; and
13	<u>(6)</u>	The state coordinating officer for active disasters or
14		the officer's designee.
15	<u>(e)</u>	In addition to the members listed in subsection (d),
16	the state	disaster recovery coordinator may request
17	participat	tion or input from members of the public, experts in
18	the field	, other government officials, and others as necessary.
19	(f)	At the discretion of the state disaster recovery
20	coordinate	or, non-state government entity members of the long-
21	term recov	very authority may be reimbursed for the member's

1	actual and	d necessary expenses, including travel expenses,
2	incurred	in carrying out the member's duties.
3	<u>(g)</u>	The long-term recovery authority shall not be subject
4	to the re	quirements of part I of chapter 92.
5	<u>§127.</u>	A- State disaster recovery coordinator; general
6	functions	, duties, and powers. The state disaster recovery
7	coordinat	or shall:
8	(1)	Report to the governor;
9	(2)	Support and convene the long-term recovery authority;
10	(3)	Establish and maintain recovery priorities and
11		strategies on behalf of the governor;
12	(4)	Convene and provide executive level coordination for
13		local, state, and federal agencies working on disaster
14		recovery programs and budgets;
15	(5)	Facilitate the collaboration of disaster recovery
16		efforts between the local, state, and federal
17		governments; the private sector; and voluntary, faith-
18		based, and community organizations;
19	(6)	Serve as a point of contact between the State and
20		applicable federal agencies and officers, including
21		the supervising federal recovery officer;

1	<u>(7)</u>	Develop a budget and operating procedures to fulfill	
2		the duties of and administer the long-term recovery	
3		authority; and	
4	(8)	Review recovery plans, policies, and decisions as	
5		required by this section and submit a report to the	
6		governor, legislature, and counties no later than	
7		twenty days prior to the convening of each regular	
8		session."	
9	SECT	ION 3. Section 127A-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
10	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted		
11	and to read as follows:		
12	" <u>"</u> Re	covery support functions" means the six key functional	
13	areas of	assistance in a coordinated framework for disaster	
14	recovery	as established by the National Disaster Recovery	
15	Framework	Guide implemented by the Federal Emergency Management	
16	Agency.	"Recovery support functions" includes recovery	
17	assistanc	e for community planning and capacity building, the	
18	economy,	health and social services, housing, infrastructure	
19	systems,	and natural and cultural resources."	
20	SECT	ION 4. The office of the governor shall establish two	
21	full-time	equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions, without regard to

- 1 chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to support the
- 2 state disaster recovery coordinator and support and provide
- 3 planning for the long-term recovery authority to carry out the
- 4 purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to fund
- 8 the two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions authorized in
- 9 section 4 and provide an operating budget for state disaster
- 10 recovery coordination activities within the office of the
- 11 governor.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the
- 13 governor for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
