A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OFFICE OF YOUTH SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 352D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§352D- Office of youth services revolving fund;
5	commercial enterprise vocational programs. (a) There is
6	established the office of youth services revolving fund to be
7	administered by the office. All moneys collected from the sale
8	of goods and services by commercial enterprise vocational
9	programs and appropriations made by the legislature shall be
10	deposited into the office of youth services revolving fund. The
11	moneys in the revolving fund shall be used for the purposes of
12	vocational programs within the office as determined by the
13	office.
14	(b) The administrators for each individual commercial
15	enterprise vocational program shall:
16	(1) Determine the prices at which all goods and services
17	are sold; provided that the prices shall be as near to



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1		the prevailing market prices for similar goods and	
2		services as practicable; and	
3	(2)	Ensure that the quality of goods and services produced	
4		is comparable to similar goods and services available	
5		from the private sector; provided that for sales to	
6		the State or the counties, the quality of the goods or	
7		services shall be consistent with the specifications	
8		for the goods or services requested.	
9	(c)	The commercial enterprise vocational programs may	
10	market goods and services to both the public and private		
11	sectors."		
12	SECT	ION 2. Section 352D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
13	amended as follows:		
14	1. Adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted		
15	and to read:		
16	""Commercial enterprise vocational program" means a		
17	vocational program through which participants engage in		
18	commercial enterprises, including the sale of goods and		
19	services, for the purpose of promoting self-sustainability in		
20	young adults."		



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1 Amending the definition of "young adult at risk" or 2. 2 "young adult" to read: 3 "'Young adult at risk" or "young adult" means any adult 4 between the ages of eighteen and twenty-four who [has]: 5 Has been arrested, [who] has had contact with the (1)6 police, [who] or is experiencing social, emotional, 7 psychological, educational, or physical problems [7]; 8 and [who is] 9 (2) Is no longer eligible for child protective services 10 provided by the State due to the adult's age." 11 SECTION 3. Section 352D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "§352D-4 Establishment; purpose. (a) There is 14 established within the department of human services for 15 administrative purposes only the office of youth services. The 16 office of youth services is established to provide services and 17 programs for youth at risk under one umbrella agency in order to 18 facilitate optimum service delivery, [to] prevent delinquency, and [to] reduce the incidence of recidivism among juveniles 19 20 through the provision of prevention, rehabilitation, and 21 treatment services. The office shall also be responsible for



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1 program planning and development, [intake/assessment,] intake 2 and assessment, and oversight, as well as consultation, 3 technical assistance, and staff training relating to the 4 delivery of services. 5 The office shall provide a continuum of services as (b) 6 follows: 7 (1)An integrated [intake/assessment] intake and 8 assessment and case management system; 9 (2) The necessary educational, vocational, social 10 counseling, and mental health services; provided that 11 the department of education shall be the only provider 12 of standards-based education services for all youth at 13 risk and young adults identified with special 14 education needs or actively receiving special 15 education services, in accordance with the Individuals 16 with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1400 et 17 seq.) and all applicable federal and state educational 18 requirements; 19 (3) Community-based shelter and residential facilities; 20 (4)Oversight of youth services; [and]

4	[(5)]	(6) Other programs that encourage the development of

14	[To-	this end, on] <u>(d) On</u> July 1, 1991, [this] <u>the</u> office	
15	shall ass	ume the responsibilities for juvenile corrections	
16	functions	, which were temporarily placed in the department of	
17	correctio	ns pursuant to Act 338, Session Laws of Hawaii 1987.	
18	These functions shall include but not be limited to all		
19	responsib	ilities, under chapter 352, for the Hawaii youth	
20	correctio	nal facilities."
