# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OFFICE OF YOUTH SERVICES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 352D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§352D-</u> Office of youth services revolving fund;
5	commercial enterprise vocational programs. (a) There is
6	established the office of youth services revolving fund to be
7	administered by the office of youth services. All moneys
8	collected from the sale of goods and services by commercial
9	enterprise vocational programs and appropriations made by the
10	legislature to the revolving fund shall be deposited into the
11	office of youth services revolving fund. The moneys in the
12	revolving fund shall be used for the purposes of vocational
13	programs within the office of youth services as determined by
14	the office.
15	(b) The administrators for each individual commercial

16 <u>enterprise vocational program shall:</u>



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1	(1)	Determine the prices at which all goods and services
2		are sold. The prices shall be as near to the
3		prevailing market prices for similar goods and
4		services as practicable; and
5	(2)	Ensure that the quality of goods and services produced
6		is comparable to similar goods and services available
7		from the private sector; provided that for sales to
8		the State or the counties, the quality of the goods or
9		services shall be consistent with the specifications
10		for the goods or services requested.
11	<u>(C)</u>	The commercial enterprise vocational programs may
12	market go	ods and services to both the public and private
13	sectors."	
14	SECT	ION 2. Section 352D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended a	s follows:
16	1.	Adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
17	and to re	ad:
18	" <u>"Co</u> :	mmercial enterprise vocational program" means a
19	vocationa	l program through which participants engage in
20	commercia	l enterprises, including the sale of goods and



1 services, for the purpose of promoting self-sustainability in 2 young adults." 3 2. Amending the definition of "young adult at risk" or 4 "young adult" to read: ""Young adult at risk" or "young adult" means any adult 5 6 between the ages of eighteen and twenty-four who [has]: 7 (1) Has been arrested, [who] has had contact with the 8 police, [who] or is experiencing social, emotional, 9 psychological, educational, or physical problems [7]; 10 and [who-is] 11 (2) Is no longer eligible for child protective services 12 provided by the State due to the adult's age." 13 SECTION 3. Section 352D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 "§352D-4 Establishment; purpose. (a) There is 16 established within the department of human services for 17 administrative purposes only the office of youth services. The 18 office of youth services is established to provide services and 19 programs for youth at risk under one umbrella agency in order to 20 facilitate optimum service delivery, [to] prevent delinquency, 21 and [to] reduce the incidence of recidivism among juveniles



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1	through t	he provision of prevention, rehabilitation, and
2	treatment	services. The office shall also be responsible for
3	program p	lanning and development, [ <del>intake/assessment,</del> ] <u>intake</u>
4	and asses	sment, and oversight, as well as consultation,
5	technical	assistance, and staff training relating to the
6	delivery	of services.
7	<u>(b)</u>	The office shall provide a continuum of services as
8	follows:	
9	(1)	An integrated [intake/assessment] intake and
10		assessment and case management system;
11	(2)	The necessary educational, vocational, social
12		counseling, and mental health services; provided that
13		the department of education shall be the only provider
14		of standards-based education services for all youth at
15		risk and young adults identified with special
16		education needs or actively receiving special
17		education services, in accordance with the Individuals
18		with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1400 et
19		seq.) and all applicable federal and state educational
20		requirements;
21	(3)	Community-based shelter and residential facilities;



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1 (4) Oversight of youth services; [and] 2 (5) Commercial enterprise vocational programs; provided 3 that these programs shall only be provided to young 4 adults; and 5 [-(5)] (6) Other programs that encourage the development of 6 positive self-images and useful skills in youth[-] at 7 risk and young adults. 8 (C) The executive director of the office of youth services 9 shall submit annual reports to the legislature no later than 10 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session, reporting the services or programs funded pursuant to this 11 12 section, the number of youth at risk and young adults served by 13 each service or program, and the results of the services or 14 programs funded. 15 [To this end, on] (d) On July 1, 1991, [this] the office 16 of youth services shall assume the responsibilities for juvenile 17 corrections functions, which were temporarily placed in the 18 department of corrections pursuant to Act 338, Session Laws of 19 Hawaii 1987. These functions shall include but not be limited 20 to all responsibilities, under chapter 352, for the Hawaii youth 21 correctional facilities."

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1	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
3	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be
4	deposited into the office of youth services revolving fund.
5	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the office of
6	youth services revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much
7	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to carry
8	out the purposes of this Act.
9	SECTION 6. The sums appropriated shall be expended by the
10	office of youth services for the purposes of this Act.
11	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
