A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC NOTICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide 2 government agencies the option to publish notice via a posting 3 on their official website, in lieu of or in addition to 4 publication in a daily or weekly publication, such as a printed 5 newspaper. Electronic posting is more expedient and cost-6 effective, particularly for routine but time-sensitive situations, such as postings of clean water environmental hazard 7 8 advisories as well as more urgent conditions, such as 9 disaster-related response and recovery activities. 10 The legislature affirms that under general rules of 11 statutory construction, where two statutes conflict, the more 12 specific statute is followed. This Act is not intended to 13 supersede procedures that assure transparency in public administration such as chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and 14

15 chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

16 SECTION 2. Section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
