# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OCEAN RECREATION COMMERCIAL PERMITS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 200-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows: 3 "(f) Any person who owns an interest in a corporation or 4 other business entity or is part of a controlled group 5 possessing a valid commercial permit issued by the department, 6 in accordance with rules adopted by the chairperson pursuant to 7 chapter 91, may transfer any or all stock or other interest to 8 another person without terminating the right of the corporation 9 or business entity to retain or renew its commercial permit or 10 any other permit issued to it by the department; provided that: 11 The corporation or business entity has been engaged in (1) 12 the same commercial vessel activity, as defined in 13 section 200-9, for a minimum of one year; 14 (2) The seller shall pay the department a business 15 transfer fee based on the passenger-carrying capacity 16 of the vessels owned or operated by the corporation or 17 business entity as provided by rules adopted by the

1		chairperson pursuant to chapter 91, except for
2		transfers of stock or interest in a corporation or
3		other business entity between spouses or first-
4		generation lineal descendants; and
5	(3)	In the case of a controlled group, the transferee
6		shall retain eighty per cent control of the
7		transferor.
8	Any person possessing a commercial permit shall be required to	
9	meet minimum revenue standards, as a condition of retaining or	
10	renewing the commercial permit.	
11	When an application for renewal of a commercial permit is	
12	made at least sixty days prior to expiration of the commercial	
13	permit, the department shall review the application and, withir	
14	thirty days of receipt of the application, shall renew the	
15	permit or notify the applicant that the application is	
16	incomplete or cannot be renewed and explain any reasons for	
17	nonrenewal. Within thirty days of receipt of the applicant's	
18	amended application, the department shall either renew the	
19	permit or notify the applicant that the permit will not be	
20	renewed.

- 1 If the holder of a commercial permit fails to timely obtain
- 2 renewal of a commercial permit, the holder of the permit shall
- 3 automatically be granted a thirty-day extension from the date of
- 4 the existing permit's expiration to obtain a permit renewal.
- 5 Except as provided in section 200-37(1), beginning on the
- 6 effective date of this Act, all new commercial permits for any
- 7 type of commercial ocean recreation activity that are not
- 8 renewals of permits initially issued before the effective date
- 9 of this Act, may be issued by the department at public auction."
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
