A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that menstrual products
are subject to sales or excise taxes in thirty-five states,
including Hawaii. Yet, in 2019, twenty-two states considered
eliminating the "tampon tax" to advance menstrual equity.

5 The legislature further finds that a study published in 6 2019 by the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists 7 found that nearly two-thirds, or sixty-four per cent, of low-8 income women in the United States could not afford menstrual 9 products during the previous year, with nearly half of these 10 women struggling to buy both food and feminine hygiene products 11 within the last twelve months.

12 The purpose of this Act is to promote menstrual equity by 13 exempting feminine hygiene products from the general excise tax 14 and providing funding to the department of education to make 15 feminine hygiene products available to students for free on 16 public secondary school campuses.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 237, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§237-</u> Exemption of feminine hygiene products. There
5	shall be exempted from, and excluded from the measure of, the
6	taxes imposed by this chapter all of the gross proceeds arising
7	from the sale of feminine hygiene products within the State,
8	including but not limited to sanitary napkins; tampons; panty
9	liners; douches; feminine hygiene syringes; and creams, foams,
10	ointments, jellies, powders, and sprays used for vaginal hygiene
11	purposes."
12	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to
15	make feminine hygiene products available to students for free on
16	public secondary school campuses.
17	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
18	education for the purposes of this Act.
19	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
