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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COMMUNITY COLLEGE PROMISE PROGRAM.

SECTION 1. The University of Hawaii promise program was

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2	founded in 2017 to increase participation in and completion of
3	college by students, particularly native Hawaiians, low-income
4	students, and those from underserved regions and populations,
5	and to prepare them for success in the workforce and their
6	communities. In the first year after its inception, this
7	scholarship program assisted one thousand students. Due to its
8	success, the University of Hawaii community college promise
9	program was codified into law by Act 14, Session Laws of Hawaii
10	2018, permanently establishing it at the community college
11	level. The Governor is proposing to expand funding for the
12	program, committing millions of dollars in State resources to
13	the program. Although successful, there is no guarantee that
14	the State receives any direct benefits from the program, as

recipients may move away after graduation, contributing to

"brain drain." Requiring recipients to commit to working in

- 1 Hawaii for five years after graduation, as a condition of
- 2 receiving scholarships from the University of Hawaii promise
- 3 community college program, would help ensure that the program
- 4 directly benefits Hawaii's workforce and economy.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 304A-506, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "[+] §304A-506[+] Hawaii community college promise program;
- 8 established. (a) Notwithstanding section 304A-501, there is
- 9 established the Hawaii community college promise program to be
- 10 administered by the board of regents. The program shall provide
- 11 [scholarships] loans for the unmet direct cost needs of
- 12 qualified students enrolled at any community college campus of
- 13 the University of Hawaii.
- 14 (b) A student enrolled at a community college campus shall
- 15 be eligible for [scholarship] loan consideration for a maximum
- 16 of eight semesters if the student:
- 17 (1) Qualifies for Hawaii resident tuition;
- 18 (2) Completes and submits the Free Application for Federal
- 19 Student Aid for each academic year and accepts all
- federal and state aid, grants, scholarships, and other
- funding sources that do not require repayment;

1	(3)	is enrolled in a classified degree or certificate	
2		program with six or more credits per semester;	
3	(4)	Maintains satisfactory academic progress, as defined	
4		by federal requirements established pursuant to Title	
5		IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended,	
6		and determined by the campus at which the student is	
7		enrolled; [and]	
8	(5)	Has been determined by the campus to have unmet direct	
9		cost needs[-]; and	
10	(6)	Commits to working in Hawaii for five years after	
11		leaving the University of Hawaii System.	
12	(c)	[Scholarships] Loans shall be awarded to the extent	
13	possible !	based on available funds and on a greatest need basis.	
14	[An award	granted] A loan awarded to a student shall be equal to	
15	the student's unmet direct cost need, based on the Free		
16	Application for Federal Student Aid calculation of need, less		
17	the amounts available to the student from Pell grants and		
18	[other] s	cholarships.	
19	[-(d) -	To maintain a scholarship under this section, a	
20	student s	hall meet the requirements of subsection (b)(4).	

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1	(e) As used in this section, "direct cost" means any		
2	cost directly related to a student's education, including		
3	tuition; educational fees; and the costs of books, supplies, and		
4	transportation between the student's dwelling and the student's		
5	campus.		
6	(e) Any loan awarded to a student pursuant to the Hawaii		
7	community college promise program shall be forgivable provided		
8	that the loan recipient works in the State of Hawaii for five		
9	years after leaving the University of Hawaii System. The board		
10	of regents may establish rules regarding compliance with		
11	paragraphs (b) and (e)."		
12	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
14	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

University of Hawaii Community College Promise Program; Loan Forgiveness Program

Description:

Converts the University of Hawaii Community College Promise Program from a scholarship to a loan program. Makes these loans forgivable if the recipient works in Hawaii for five years after graduation from college. Authorizes the Board of Regents to establish rules regarding the program.

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
